beginning the first place subject, I give, devise and bequeath all my lands in the Counties of Lincoln, Chittenden and elsewhere with all my land rights in Kentucky, Vermont or elsewhere in whatever quantities in Military or other Service, or in whatever manner accruing or to accrue, with all my Interest therein also all my Negroes, to wit, Stevens, Archibald, Sam, Guar, Henry, Thomas, Levaney, with all the increase of the female Slaves, likewise all my stock of Horses, Cattle, Hogs, Sheep, with my Negroes, Plantation Utensils and Household Furniture, with all other my estate real & personal in possession or in expectancy to the child or children which my wife is (as I suppose) now pregnant and to her, her or their heirs and assigns forever, to hold the same if more than one, as Tenants in Common, reserving to my said beloved wife, the use enjoyment and profits thereof until the said child or children shall have attained the age of twenty one year, if he, she or they shall so long live, at which period I further Will and devise that the said Estate shall be equally divided between my said wife and the said child or children, and that she shall from thenceforth hold and enjoy her proportion or share thereof to her own use and
