to my son William Bethell the land and plantation whereon

I now live. Item I give and bequeath to my son Thomas

Beckle one negroe man named Bob after my decease
one negroe Girl named Patt one negroe boy named Sam
one leather Chair, one two gallon stone Jug, one little trunk
one Snuggel Coat, two small Dishes & two plates to her
her heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my young
daughter Ann Baker one bed and furniture which I
now lie and one large trunk to her and her heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Ann Baker
