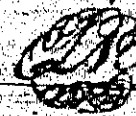


I declare: In the name of God Amen I Thomas Bowles of Henrico County

 bequeath in the form and manner following. Item I give & bequeath
 to my son Thomas Bowles the Land and plantation whereon I
 now live to him and his heirs forever but desire that my two
 daughters Sarah & Rosalinda Bowles to live in the house that I

names of Thomas, Joseph, Christina, Mary, Sarah & Rosalinda, but
now I constitute and appoints my son Thomas Bowles John Henry
Junior Executor of this my last Will & Testament disannulling all former
Wills by me made this only to stand in force In Witness Whereof I have
set my hand & seal this 19th day of November one thousand
seven hundred and eighty three.
