Will

In the name of God amen I Thomas Purmar of Henrico
County the 14th day of May 1762, being weak in body but thank
God am in perfect mind & memory and calling to mind the
uncertainty of this mortal life do make, appoint, pronounce & declare
this to be my last Will & Testament: first & principally being penitent
for my past sins I surrender my soul to God who gave it and
thru the name of Jesus Christ by whose merit I hope to be
glorified & expect salvation and hope to stand justified before God
at the last day; As for my body I commit to earth at the discretion
of my executors, to be buried, not doubting but that it will
be united to my soul again at the last day As for Temporal estate
or worldly Goods I give and bestow in manner & form following
Item I give and bequeath unto my son Samuel Purmar and
he or part of him containing one hundred Acres lying or
being in Chickahominy Swamp in Henrico County known by
the name of Tower to him and his heirs forever Item I give &
bequeath unto my wife Anne Purmar & Thomas Purmar the
same where I now live to be equally divided
between them & their heirs & assigns forever

together with the said Margaret to my to have and full
 my to have and full the said Margaret and then have given
 them to my beloved wife Margaret Puryear the same
 part of my estate till the youngest of my children comes of age
 and then for it to be equally divided amongst them all that is
 to say amongst my wife & children & now I constitute &
 ordain my beloved wife whole executrix of this my Will
 & disannulling all other Wills by me made this duly to be
 proved in Court without the Executor giving security or any
 part of the estate being appraised In Witness my hand &
 Seal I have set the day and year above written
 Done, Signed, pronounced, Thomas Puryear
 and Declared in presence of
