

Richmond in Virginia 11th Feby 1784. I Timothy Allen of
T. Allen. } said City do hereby make my last Will and Testament
Will. } Inprimis I leave the sum of five Guineas unto my Brother John
Allen my Quarter Land of Kilmandel held by Virtue of
a Lease of lives renewable forever from the Earl of Antrim
lying & being situated near Clough Mills in the County
of Antrim Kingdom of Ireland subject however to the
following incumbrances that is to say that until the
Marriage or death of my Sisters Margery Ellen Allen
there shall be paid unto each of them out of the Profit
rent of said Quarter Land the sum of five Guineas annually
- Two Guineas and a half to Margery the first day of every
May three Guineas and a half to her the first day of
every November: until her said Marriage when this
bequest is to cease & become void - And in addition the

following indentures that is to say in witness
Marriage or death of my Sisters Margery Ellen Allen
there shall be paid unto each of them out of the Profit
rent of said Quarters, unto the sum of five Guineas annually
Two Guineas and a half to Margery the first day of every
May three Guineas and a half to Ellen the first day of
every November until her said Marriage when this
bequest is to cease & become void & this rent shall then the
said sum of money to cease in same manner

But should my Sisters unfortunately become
widowed & no reason being made for
their death & no child that
survives of year then they
shall receive the same without

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such provision of more than ten pounds yearly
will be entitled to receive from & I hereby bequeath
unto such one or becoming so a Widow or unto
both so becoming Widows the sum of ten pounds
yearly out of my said profit rents of Kilmandie
to be paid also in half yearly payments that is to
say five pounds at May & five pounds at Novemb.
to each & one becoming so a Widow or should they
both ~~be~~ become Widows then they are each to receive
the said sum of five pounds every first of May and
every first day of Novemb. from the said profit rents -
As to whatever sum may fall to my Share of the Money
due by the late Mr. Allen of Dunover I desire it
may be divided into three equal Shares & go Shares &

may be divided into three equal Shares & go Share &
Share alike unto my Brother & my two Sisters, also
all other property that may fall to me from my
Father's Estate — The money due me on a Settlement

of Montgomery Pitts's Books & debts may be
disposed of in the following manner should it
be known from unforeseen accidents not prove any thing
I am very well it that no notice is taken of these
requests to the prejudice of my Brother & Sister, with
respect to that part of my property already disposed of

(P) I leave Montgomery the like sum of fifty Guineas.

I leave my friend Thomas Carson of Belfast twenty Guineas as a token of affectionate remembrance, & unto my friend John Shannon of Tottinham ten Guineas, as another token of my great friendship.

I hereby appoint John Campbell Esq. of Belfast my Partner Alex^r Montgomery and my Brother John Allan Executors to this my last Will.

And all property that I did possess of not disposed of in this my Will, I desire may be divided into

three equal Shares one full third of which I desire may be paid to my said Brother John, and there to my Sister Mary, and the other third to my Sister Ann.

I leave and bequeath unto James White of Whitehall fifty Guineas, as a small token of the grateful remem-

gratitude, as to which I am under the greatest obli-
gation I have of the many obligations I our family
be under to him this - I also bequeath unto my cousin
Timothy Hamilton son of James Hamilton of York
Sheweth the sum of fifty Guineas as a like token of
my grateful remembrance of that family - I hereby
revokes all bequeathments or Testament theretofore made
by me acknowledging this as my only true Will
