following incumbrances that is to say that until the

Marriage or death of my Sisters Margaret Ellison Allen

there shall be paid unto each of them out of the profits

rent of said Quaker Lands the sum of Two Guineas annually

Two Guineas and a half to Margaret the first day of every

July the Guineas and a half to be the first day of

every November untill his said Marriage otherwise

bequest is to cease & become void - And in testimony the

Marriage or death of my Sisters Margaret & Anne Atton  
there shall be paid unto each of them out of the Produc-  
t of said Estate, and the sum of five Guineas annually  
for Years and a half beginning the first day of every  
May these Garrison and wharf to be the first day of  
every May during their joint marriage unless the  
husband shall be dead before the end of the same. The  
sum of five Guineas to be paid in Guinea money  
and not in Bills or Notes. This instrument  
shall be held valid and good notwithstanding the  
husband shall be dead before the end of the same. The  
husband shall be bound to pay the sum of five Guineas  
to his wife for the use of her husband during  
the time he shall be dead.

fifty guineas, as a small token of the grateful remem-

in order to him this - take back with my favor

Second the sum of fifty pounds as a like token of  
my grateful remembrance of that family - Thirdly  
 nichts all being well or Testament Recd of us made

February 1784
