Sarah Bullington six negroes named Sumner, Charles, Joseph, Thos,
Marcel, Ficus and the third part of all my Stock consisting Horses Cattle
Pigs and all the Household and Kitchen furniture and the crop of wheat
that now growing during her life and after her decease to be equally
divided between my two Children Francis Bullington and that one that is
yet in her belly with and also the rest of my negroes named Madeline
Loe, Fanny, Kate, Beck, Fanny, and Jeffery and all the rest of my Estate
I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke, and disannul all and every other former
Will by me in any way before made and bequeathed
and giving and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament
