by and for the said Court.

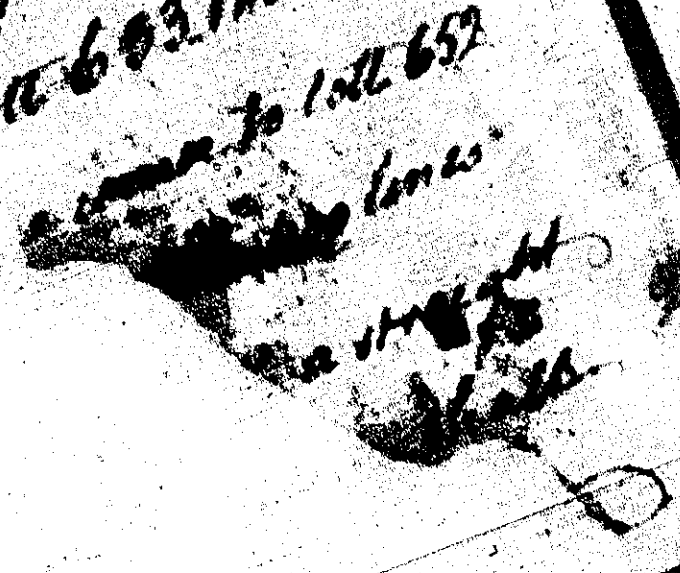

of my lands or so much thereof as may be necessary in
such manner & on such terms as shall appear to them
to be most advantageous and I hereby empower them to sell
the same and to make sufficient title to the purchasers
in fee or for any lesser estate. In this disposition of my
lands I mean to include all my lots in the City of
Richmond or elsewhere and all my Islands in James
River and all my other lands and privileges belonging to them

Richmond or else where and all my Island
river and also my forces and privileges belonging
to me the payment of my debts I dispose of the residue
of my estate in manner following: I give to Mrs. Margaret
James the house in which I now live together with the
land off the fall line belonging and one acre of land to be
in the north line of the Town line to begin at a stone
with the Town line and run the line
at right angles
from their



My wife Isabella and I have and do hereby give to
and bequeath the son of Monimian
Reuben Coult natural son of my brother Patrick Coult
deceased and to his heirs forever my right to the reversion of
the south ferry together with the plot of land belonging to
it and all the privileges and appurtenances belonging to
the said Lot as expressed in the Deed of the same which
was given by Col^d William Boyd deceased.

Item I give freedom to Josiah the son of Monimian
and desire that he may be sent to school by my executor at
the expense of my estate for two years that he may then be
bound out to some house and that at the age of twenty one
years he may be advanced him towards settling

years of age or more in any of the above
him up in his trade. I give to Patience
daughter of Mrs. Margaret Barnes five hundred pounds
to be paid to her when she attains her age of twenty years
or sooner if my executor shall think proper to do so.

Executors of this my last Will and Testament,
truly making all former and other Wills whatsoever
of mine void and of no effect.
