Martha Jacobs one fourth part of the same
I give to my daughter Elizabeth Jacobs one
fourth part of the same I give to my daughter

I have made my will in full of all I own among my children then living. And my own wife that if my son Robert Jones should die without lawful issue of his body then that part of my Estate that I have Will'd & bequeath'd to him may likewise be sold and the money arising may be equally divided among all his brothers and Sisters then living. Here I do appoint my Wife Katherine Jones my son Robert Jones Executor of this my last Will & Testament for witnesses whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fifth day of February one thousand seven hundred and Twenty seven.

This Will was proved by the Oaths of Jonathan Bridgewater
and William Bridgewater Witnesses being his Obedience to his Obedience

ordered who made both Parties together with Robert Sneyd

presence of one hundred and fifty persons. Conditions in the
said Oath Certificate was granted him for obtaining
a probate thereof in due form; nothing being reserved to the
