to be decently buried And for the rest of my
Worldly Estates after my Debts paid I do give
of in manner & form following. I do Give unto
my Son John Clark and to his Heirs all
whatsoever that do belong to me by any Rights
Patents or otherways whatsoever with the
Feather-bed unto me now belonging with
furniture belongs to it with one half of my
Cattle are mine And the other half I do
and Bequeath to my Wife Jane Clark

...with all other my furniture
... & Woolen only such excepted
... in this my Will specified. Item I do
... unto my Daughter in Law Jane Brunt one
... Bed with what Furniture belongs to it.
I do acknowledge that six hundred pounds of Tobacco
due from John Shary doth belong unto Jane Brunt
Item I do give unto my two Kins Woman Ann
How & Mary Clark each of them one Cow Calf
to be delivered this Fall. And Whereas
Mary Clark is a Covenant Servant for seven Years
I do remitt and give her three Years of her time
Item I do desire & appoint that my servants
shall be kept together and the one half of
the Benefit of their Labour shall be made use
of for the Maintenance of my Son John Clark
at School. Item I do give unto Thomas
Holmes & John Williams each of them one
Yearling Heifer. Item I do give unto
Godwin, John Williams Watchman and my
Servant each of them one Cow Calf to be
delivered the next Fall after this. Item it is my Will
that my Wife Jane Clark shall not make over
nor give at her decease any part of this Estate
from my Son John Clark, but at her Decese
all which I have left to her for her Maintenance
to be properly his. Likewise I do make my
loving Wife Jane Clark my lawful Executor
and no other And I do appoint my well
beloved friends Robert Bird Overseer of this my
Will for the performance of it to all true

Intents & purposes. Thus I do hereby
all former Wills nullifying them:
& Confirming this In Witness
whereunto set my Hand this 3^d March.

these presents shall come to be seen
Greeting of the Isle of Wight County send Greeting
Whereas the Right
Honorable John Bennett Esq^r Governor and Captain
in Chief of the said Isle of Wight County bearing date
the 18th day of November 1652. Gave
unto me the said Henry Watts four hundred
and fifty seven Acres of Land lying in the Isle of Wight
County the said four hundred fifty seven Acres of the
said Land being formerly granted unto me the said
Henry Watts by Patent dated the 18th of October 1643
and the other three hundred Acres being also formerly
granted by Patent unto John Spachman dated the 13th
July 1635 and purchased of the said Spachman by
me the said Henry Watts which said four hundred
fifty seven Acres of Land is bounded as by the said
Letter Patent relation being thereunto heretofore
appeareth Now know Ye that I the said
Watts for a valuable Consideration have
