Vinton of the Isle of Wight County in Virginia
being sick of Body but in perfect Memory do
Declare this as my Last Will and Testament in Manner
and Form as followeth. (That is to say) First I commit my
Soul to the Earth from whence it came to be decently
Interred at the discretion of my Executors hereafter in
this Wills mentioned. And my Soul to God hoping for
salvation through the Merits of my Lord & Saviour
Jesus Christ, and for such worldly goods as God in his
Mercy hath bestowed upon me I bequeath and Give in
Manner & Form following, *Imprimis*, Item
I give Give & bequeath unto my eldest son John
Vinton all that Tract of Land being part of it in the
Tenure of John King, James Baynath, & Nicholas
Morris, containing in the whole Eight Hundred and
fifty Acres of Land, and if the said John Vinton
die before he comes to the Age of one and twenty
years then I give and bequeath the said Land unto

Sub. Will. In Witness, I do
 Oplem. have herunto set my hand
 Sixteenth day of January Anno Domini
 It is so be understood that what
 of in that Tract of fifteen
 upon the precepts by Ambrose
 upon condition, and the remainder
 before provided.

 bought of Capt. John Oplem, the deceased husband
 of the Above-mentioned M^rs Margaret Oplem
 and disjunct from the same by Two Swamps
 bounded on the Northside with that piece of Land
 whereon M^r Symonds old house standeth, and on
 the Southside with a Tract of Land commonly called
 Howlands Neck, with housing and all other
 thereunto belonging freely to be enjoyed by the
 said John Babcher his heirs &c. without
 without Let or Molestation from the
 Date hereof unto the next
