Wardmore to receive free pardon & Remission of all
my sins and my Body to the Earth from whence it
came to be decently Buried at the Discretion of
my Executor hereafter named in Parish Church of
the County above. But as concerning all such
Worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to
endow me I give & bequeath in form following.

I, William Ivory, do hereby certify that I have given
and my Executors have satisfied Imprimis I give
and bequeath unto Elizabeth Penny the daughter of Richard Penny
of the County of Essex One quarter Cow Colp. Item I give
and bequeath unto Robert Ruffin Son of William Ruffin of
the Isle of Wight County of one black Horse with two
white feet behind of two years old of the proper Mark
of me the said William Ivory. Item I give & bequeath
unto John Arram Son of John Arram of the County
of the City that my red Horse now goeth with all
all & singular the rest of my Estate I give & bequeath
unto my dear & loving friend of age John Arram
and of this my last Will & Testament do make & devise
him full & sole Executor In Witness whereof
the said William Ivory Renouncing all former Wills
to this my last Will & Testament have set my Hand
the first of January Anno Domini 1651
