

- 115 name of God Amen. In my eight day of September year of our Lord one thousand five hundred and eighteen I make & seal this in the town of Higham in the County of Hertfordshire very sick & weak in body and understanding memory, thanks be given unto God almighty, calling to mind remembrance of my body and knowing what is appointed for all men once to die, do make this my last will & Testament (that is to say) principally first of all I give & command my soul, into hands of God that giveth and honoureth my body I command it to be buried in a Christian decent manner, with distribution of my estate nothing doubting God's general judgment, I shall receive it same again by my right hand of God as I had at the time of my birth whereas it hath pleased God to take me in this life I give and devise my disposition of my following manner & forme
- I give unto my son Will Tyndale & his wife my plantation whereof I now have containing one hundred & forty acres of land more or less, to althousing & orchards, & all other appurtenances belonging thereto after my decease, I also give unto my living Sonne Nicholas after of a tract of land in Lechlade North part of Upper leach of 30 acres, containing three hundred acres, & also three hundred & forty acres on pottles or acres, where Robt Thomas doth live, & also forty five of Lechlade on the other, & also the rest of his inheritance after my decease either by Bills or Cents, to his wife or to his children & his heirs.
- I give to my daughter Margaret, two Cows & Calves, & my plantation whereof she now lives in Rotherwasch, being & remained after of land before given to her brother
- I give unto my daughter Mary five Cows & Calves, & also two hundred acres of land on Lechlade, being & remained after of land before given to her brother
- I give unto my daughter Elizabeth five Cows & Calves, & also two hundred acres of land on Lechlade, being & remained after of land before given to her brother
- I give unto my daughter Margaret part thereof One Cow & two Hogs & pott herbs & one Pudding & one pair of Blankets & one Sheet
- I give unto my daughter Elizabeth five Cows & Calves & one young mare called Shetby, One small pott of herbs & pott herbs, to her brother God in Lechlade on my sofe, to one Pudding & pair of Blankets & one pair of Sheets
- I give unto my daughter Sarah One Cow & Calve, if shee will have it and no more
- I give unto my sonne Nicholas my Owne Riding Horse called Silver
- I give unto my daughter Mary one young mare called Bonny
- I give unto my sonne in law Edward part of one black furred mare
- I give unto my two daughters Elizabeth & Mary one mare called Nancy & her mares, and my sonne Nicholas to divide & amongst between them
- I give unto my sonne Nicholas Town sides of Tanned leather, I also give unto my sonne Will Nicholas three Iron wedges & all my Carpenters Tools
- I give unto my third daughter Margaret Mary & Elizall all my Household stuffe & is not alreade given excepting out great Basin & one smalle Basin, & bark of my One Stock of Bees, & two staves of Bees unto my sonne Will Tyndale and all rest of my Estate I give & desire it may be done equally divided among of rest of my children excepting my Daughter Sarah, & my last of her shall have not more than is already given her
- I give unto my daughter Eleanor one hundred & fifty acres of land in Horncastle Congleton further more or less I say to her & her Heires

2<sup>o</sup> I do hereby constitute and ordene appoint my sonning James Marshall Jr. of Mont  
wright County my, whole & sole Exec of this my last will & Testament, to take care of my estate  
prostain, & I do hereby strictly command, direct & command all & every other forme of my Re-  
& legarys to do & by me made in every wayes before this my hand was sealed & confirmed—  
testifying & bearing witness this present year to come that will & Testament, in witness whereof  
I have hereunto sett my hand & sealing daily day & year before mentioned.

In y<sup>e</sup> Name of God Amen, y<sup>e</sup> 20<sup>th</sup> day of October 1703 I the last of Newpart Parish in y<sup>e</sup> County of  
y<sup>e</sup> Isle of Night being sick evill in body, but of sound report in memory (praise be given to God for y<sup>e</sup>  
same), knowing y<sup>e</sup> unconstancy of this life on earth, & being desirous to settle things in order to make  
this my last Will & Testament in manner & forme following: That is to say first & principally I do  
conserue my soul to Almighty God my creator, after my decease, & saving that I shall receive full pardon  
for remission of all my sinnes saved by y<sup>e</sup> precious death, crucifixion of my blessed saviour, & ascension  
of Christ Jesus, my body to y<sup>e</sup> Earth, from whence it was taken, to be buried in euerlastant Christian  
manner, as to my selfe hereafter named shall be thought most convenient. And as for what  
mytly estates y<sup>e</sup> Lord in Merry Hall bente me, my Will concerning y<sup>e</sup> same shall be employed, as  
hereafter by this my Will concerning y<sup>e</sup> same shall be expressed. & first I do hereby renounce  
franchise & make void, all Wills by me made, & declare, & appoint this my last Will & Testament:

I give & devise unto my sonnes William West, & Kitchell West, all y<sup>e</sup> land lying betwixt N<sup>m</sup>  
Greens, & Rob<sup>t</sup> Bagnall if being one hundred acres more or less for eoursing y<sup>e</sup> naturall lives  
equally to be divided betwixt y<sup>e</sup> my son William to have y<sup>e</sup> part of y<sup>e</sup> land next to N<sup>m</sup>  
Greens, & after y<sup>e</sup> decease, to y<sup>e</sup> heirs of y<sup>e</sup> bodys lawfull begotten, for ever.

I give & devise unto my son Rob<sup>t</sup> West, one part of a tract of land, viz: I purchased of Capt<sup>r</sup> John  
Marshall att a white Oak, in a little branch, 300 downe y<sup>e</sup> little branch to a long branch,  
& 300 downe y<sup>e</sup> said long branch, unto N<sup>m</sup> Westwards line, & from y<sup>e</sup> said white Oak downe  
Indian path to Capt<sup>r</sup> Appletons line, 200 along Capt<sup>r</sup> Appletons line Eastward unto  
N<sup>m</sup> Westwards corner line, & 200 along Capt<sup>r</sup> Appletons line to y<sup>e</sup> first stile for  
duriung his naturall life, & after his decease unto y<sup>e</sup> heirs of his body lawfull begotten for ever.

I give & devise unto my son N<sup>m</sup> West, & Kitchell West y<sup>e</sup> remainder of y<sup>e</sup> aforesaid land bought  
of Capt<sup>r</sup> John Marshall lying on y<sup>e</sup> South side of y<sup>e</sup> Indian path beginning att Round hill, running up  
Capt<sup>r</sup> Marshall's line to y<sup>e</sup> Indian path, 200 from Round hill along Capt<sup>r</sup> Pitts line, to Capt<sup>r</sup>  
Appletons line, & 200 along Capt<sup>r</sup> Appletons line to y<sup>e</sup> Indian path, for eoursing y<sup>e</sup> naturall  
lives, equally to be divided betwixt y<sup>e</sup> Capt<sup>r</sup> & y<sup>e</sup> decease unto y<sup>e</sup> heirs of y<sup>e</sup> bodys lawfull begotten  
for ever.

I give & devise unto my son Rob<sup>t</sup> West y<sup>e</sup> land wherein he now liveth no: I bought of Mr John  
Marshall y<sup>e</sup> 16<sup>th</sup> of this instant about one hundred peicey acres for eoursing his naturall life, & after  
his decease unto y<sup>e</sup> heirs of his body lawfull begotten for ever.
