

I give & bequeath my loving wife Sarah Boulger, Two thirds of all that I do have by good or bad of worldly goods, of all I have & enjoy within doors & without after my last death being 42

I give & bequeath to my only daughter, Sarah Boulger, One Third of all my personal estate, to be paid to my daughter to have her proportionable parts of all debts or charges that shall or may arrive, my manner of payment by reason of this my last will & Testament, As witness my hand & seal this 14th day of March 1705

Proved in open Court for the Justices of the County of Middlesex the 17th day of Aug 1706 to be the last will & Testament of Thomas Boulger by the Oathes of all the witnesses & probate ordered to this effect the Court doth command

In the name of God Amen, I Anne Jones widow of the late of the County of Middlesex, now being in a very weak condition by sickness but I thank Almightie God, at this time in perfect sense & memory doe make this my last will & Testament in manner & forme following, first I commend my soul unto my only maker God our Father, and my Body for to be decently buried by my loved husband John Jones & my Children

Item I give & bequeath unto my sonne John Jones that planter who now lives on, by estimation Three hundred acres of land, being purchased as this, first of One hundred acres of Amos Palmer, & One hundred of John Peters Sr, and One hundred acres of Henry Martin, I say I give & bequeath this heretofore said land unto my sonne John Jones, he having the heirs of his body, lawfull begotten, by his Body, But if it should please God that my sonne John Jones, should die without any issue male, then for to fall to my sonne Abraham Jones, & his heirs lawfull begotten of his Body.

Item I give unto my sonne John Jones one feather bed & bolster, and such bedding as shall be to it when I dye - also I give unto my sonne John Jones, Six pewter dishes & two pewter plates & two pewter jugs, also I give him one pewter saucer & one Copper one, three doz of pewter spoons also the best of my silver table spoons - & one doz of napkins, also one brass candlestick & one Iron spit, & one Iron pot of about three gallons, & one Iron pan, & one quart pot of one year Old, also I give him half of the stock, that shall then be upon the plantation where he now lives when please God I shall dye

Item I give unto my sonne John Jones his three children, to say, Joseph Jones John Jones & Anne Jones, One share to my sonne John Jones has now in his possession, the said share he is to receive for to him, for the good of my three said children I doe order & appoint, that if in years to come should be sold for the good of my said three children, according to my sonne John Jones his direction & the efforts for to be laid out, in house goods for the said children when they shall come to age also I give & bequeath unto my three Grandchildren each of them one young Heifer, not for to be under one year Old, the increase of the said Heifers for to be sold for the best advantage for my three said children

Item I give unto my daughter Anne Barnes part of my wearing Robes at my decease both Linen & Woollen Cloaths & also for two Robes

Item I give unto my sonne Abraham Jones all & remaining part of my estate that I shall dye seized of and after his decease then for the lawfull begotten Children of his Body, And if that my sonne Abraham Jones should dye without Children, then for to fall to my sonne John Jones Children, also in like manner (that is to say) If my sonne John Jones has Children should dye lawfull begotten Children then for to fall to my sonne Abraham Children, and if sonne should both dye without any such Children. then for to fall to my daughter Anne Barnes Children

Attest I do make my Sonne Abraham Jones whole & sole Ex^r of this my last will & Testament and do appoint
that said Abraham Smith & John Applewhite for to see it performed & they have accordingly my hand this
the 15th day of April anno 1704.

e order this my last will & Testament as followeth, I give & bequeath my soul to God almighty God my maker & my
body to God Heavens, from my will & pleasure to be appointed in simple manner, Thomas Walter & Richard Nelson my
son to be my Executors lawful overseers, over this my will & Testament, over all my Estate in Virginia
from my will is that the said Thomas Walter shall have, the disposing of all such goods, wares, & effects of
mine that are aboard the ship called the King's Head from I give & bequeath unto my Sonne John
Edward all singular & wholly my pleasure in Virginia called by the name of the King's Head, with all the goods & things
of the County of York, containing thirteen hundred & eighty acres, or thereabouts, from I give & bequeath unto my Sonne
James Edward all singular & wholly my lands in Virginia called by the name of Blackwater, in the County of York of
Virginia, with all Rights & Titles, & all other Lands or Tenements, whatsoever, shall appear to me belonging in Virginia (the said
here only excepted) to the will to be disposed of according to my last will & Testament from I give & bequeath
unto my wife Sarah Edward, all my goods that I have aboard the said ship, to the goods & effects of the said ship, and two
years after, to my son shall make or receive, or by goods sold or by Bills & Bonds or Bonds to receive for my use in
Virginia, and at the end of the said three years time, I do give & bequeath unto my Sonne John Edward & James
Edward, equally to be divided between them, all my Bills & Bonds & Tenements, & writings to receive, to goods & effects and
all things & effects, moveables, that is or are to me belonging unto my Sonne & James, after the said time of
three years equally to be divided between them, from I give & bequeath unto the said John & James, after the said time of
three years, my five Acres to be disposed of as the Overseers of the said parish shall think fit, from I give & bequeath
unto my said Overseers, the said Thomas Walter, Thomas Walter & Richard Nelson, forty shillings apiece, from I give &
bequeath unto Sarah the wife of the said James, two Acres, from my will is that my Sonne, Thomas & Richard Nelson
shall have the disposing of my son Richard Edward for three years unto whom he shall think fit
to transfer & provision according to his will, and at the end of the said three years my will is that the said Richard Edward
shall have out of my stock of the said parish, one Cow, I do acknowledge this to be the last will & Testament
of the said John Edward, made the 15th day of April, in the year of our Lord God, One Thousand six hundred &
four
