I give & bequeath to my only daughter, Sarah Bulger, one third of all my personal estate, to be divided equally, my daughter to bear her proportionable part of all debts or charges that shall or may arise, my widow or son by reason of this my last will & Testament, As witness my hand & seal this 14th day of March 1700/01

In memory of God Amos, I leave James Bulger of the free of Bright County, now being in a very weak condition by sickness but I thank Almighty God, at this time in perfect sense & memory do make this my last will & Testament in manner following, first I command my soul unto my only maker & sustainer God alone, and my body for to be decently buried by my said Husband John Jones & my children.

Item I give & bequeath unto my sonne John Jones that plantation where he now liveth on, by estimation Three hundred acres of land, being purchased as thus, first One hundred acres of Land on Palmer, & One hundred of John park: 5th, and One hundred acres of Henry Martin, I say I give & bequeath this plantation of land unto my sonne John Jones, & during the lives of his body, lawful begotten, by his Body, But if it should please God that my sonne John Jones should die before any other male, then for to fall to my sonne Abraham Jones, & his Heires lawfull Begotten of his Body.

Item I give unto my sonne John Jones one feather bedge Bedster, and such bedding as shall be fit when I dye — also I give unto my sonne John Jones, Six pounder double Gun powder plates & gun powder, Also I give him one peacocke Standard one Pepper one, three doz of powder spoures also the best of my Depository Books — & One doz of hats, also one Bras^t Caudle shirt & One iron spitt, & one Iron pot of about three gallons, & one Ironing pan, One pair of old year Old, also I give him halfe of his Bed, so that shall then compen the plantation where he now liveth when places God I shall dye.

Item I give unto my sonne John Jones his three children to say, Joseph Jones John Jones & Ann Jones, One man to my sonne John Jones lies now in his possession, And I make him no cause for to come for the good of my three Grandchildren. No order appon that my increase & male should be sold for the good of my three Grandchildren, according to my sonne John Jones his direction & this effects for to be laid out in household goods for said children which they shall come to by.

Also I give & bequeath unto my three Grandchildren each of them one young Heifer, neither to be under One year old, the increase of the same Heifers for to be sold for the best advantage for my three Grandchildren.

Item I give unto my Daughter Anna Barnes part of my widdowing Goods att my decess both silver & Brass & one iron & two heifers.

Item I give unto my sonne Abraham Jones the remaining part of my estate that I shall dye seized of my life to be sold to him for his lawfull Begotten Children of his Body, and if that my sonne Abraham Jones should dye without children, then for to fall to my sonne John Jones (which is to say) If my sonne John Jones his children should dye lawfull Begotten Children then for to fall to my sonne Abraham Jones, and if no sonnes should both dye without any such children, then for to fall to my Daughter Anna Barnes (which is)

After I do make my Sonne Abraham Jones wherby to g^t of this my last will & Testament and do appoynt
that Capt Arthur Smith & his Appoyntment to see it performed & they have executed my said will
the 15th day of April anno 1704.

In the name of God almighty I John Soward being sick in Body but of full memory (thankes be to God) do make & ordene this my last will & Testament as followeth: In first I doe bequeath my soule to god almighty and my mortall body to g^t Heaven; Item my wile pleasure to be appoynted in Stephen Warren, Thomas Waller, Richard Holloway my sonnes to be my trusty & lawfull executors, over this my Will & Testamet, over almy testamet writing
from my will is that hi^r Stephen Warren shall have the disposing of all such goods, singularly, & chalke of
hunc that are aboard the ship called the King Richard, whom I give bequeath unto my sonne John
Soward, all singular chalke my plowman in Brig ruled by the name of the Long Hatch, which he by g^t buying
Isle of Wight County, containing Thirteen hundred & fifties acres or thereabouts, I have also bequeath unto my sonne
James Soward all singulare chalke my plowman in Brig ruled by the name of the Hatchet, in Isle of
Wight w^t all Rights & other tenures, & all other lands or tenures, whatsoever, shall appoynt to me belonging in Eng^t (for the
same chalke excepted) to this tyme to be disposed of according to my will otherwise I bequeath unto my sonne John
Soward my wife Sarah Soward, all my goods that I have aboard this said ship, to his agents Chapman & Tott, and two
pounds after to my sonne Richard Soward, or to my sonne John Soward, or to my sonne James Soward for my up-
keep, and altho' this ethesse three years hundreth, I do give & bequeath unto my seruants John Soward & James
Soward, equally to be divided between them, all my Books & Boxes, & curiosities, & sover, to goods chalke and
all things chalke, inestimable, that is or are to me belonging unto my sonne John & James, after the tyme of
three years equally to be divided betwix them. Item I give & bequeath unto poor of St. Pauls where they
have doff^r tye, my two shillings for the disposal of as^r provision of St. Pauls shall think fit, Item I give & bequeath
unto my sonnes, hi^r Stephen Warren, Thomas Waller, Richard Holloway, forly shillings apaire. Item I give &
bequeath unto Sarah my wife of hi^r Warren, two pounes, Item my will is that my deare frindes Christopher & John
Warren, shall have disposing of my sonne Richard Soward for three years unto whom he shall think fit,
the like & provision according to hisfome, and altho' this bound my will is to be observed Richard Soward
shall have out of my stock of leather in vry one poun, I do acknowledge this to be my last will & Testament
signed under my hand & seal, the thirteenth day of November, in 5th year of our Lord God, One thousand six hundred &
