

In the Name of God Amen I Anthony Holladay of the County of Wright being weak in body but of good spirit mind & memory thanks to his mercies for the of his knowing of mortality of his body & being desirous to settle things in due order do there fore by make this my last will & testament in manner & form following that is to say first and principally I do commend my soul unto almighty God my heavenly king & my that I shall be saved by the merits of my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ & my being of Earth from whence I cannot be buried in a Christian and decent manner at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named and as touching such worldly Estate as God in mercy has bestowed upon me in this life I do here by give and bequeath of the same in the following manner & form - I give & bequeath unto my Son Jonas Holladay my Great Silver tankard my pistols & holsters and sword and suit of harness & vallies of Damask & Counterpane -

I then I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah & her progeny negro woman called Judoo and her future Increase to her & her heirs for ever -

I then I give & bequeath unto my Son in Law James Knott and Mary his now wife my negro woman called Hannah with her future Increase to them and their heirs for ever also I give & bequeath my two negro Gules one called Gumbo & other called Venus unto my Son in Law James Knott and Mary his now wife together with their Increase to them & their heirs for ever -

I then I give & bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Elizabeth Holladay daughter & bolster up of Holland Street & a pair of Course Sheets a Rug & a blanket to be delivered at her day of marriage -

I then I give & bequeath unto my grand Son Joseph Holladay one half of a land I bought of Brother Marshall being about five hundred acres to it more or less to him & his heirs & his body Lawfully begotten for ever -

I then I give & bequeath unto my grand Son Anthony Country Holladay son of my Son Samuel Holladay Decd of the remaining part of a land bought of Brother Marshall being of other half thereof to him & his heirs of his body Lawfully begotten for ever -

I then I give & bequeath unto my grand Son Anthony Country Holladay son of my Son Samuel Holladay Decd of Land I bought of James Volentine and the new Brother being one hundred & thirty acres when he came of Law five ago and to his heirs of his body Lawfully begotten for ever together with all the stock of Cattle Sheep Hogs & horses and four negroes named by Cesar Polle Luke Tim & their future Increase to him and his heirs of his body Lawfully begotten for ever -

I then I give & bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Catherine my body one feather bed and furniture to be delivered at her day of marriage -

Item It is my Desire of four negroes namely (our pollo Luko & tin may) to remain
 upon of plantation given to my Grandson namely Anthony Covinton Holladay
 Item I give and bequeath unto my Grand Children namely of Children of my Son
 Immanuel Holladay Doe & of Children of my Son Joseph Holladay Doe and of
 Children of my Daughter Sarah Murphrey & Remains or of my personal
 Estate and disposed of including my Son namely Jonas Holladay and my Daughter
 Mary Knott they are to have their Equal parts in & personal Estate
 given in this paragraph to my Grand Children being to be Divided in to
 five parts only my wearing apparel & of Doves next - - -
 Item I give and bequeath all my wearing apparel woolen and Linen unto
 my Son Jonas Holladay & my Grand Son Wm Knott Equally to be Divided
 Item and Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my Son namely Jonas
 Holladay and my Grand Son namely Anthony Covinton Holladay to
 be Executors of this my Last will & testament and that of house and
 goods and plantation or Remain in the hands of my Son Jonas Hol-
 laday until my Grand Son Anthony Comes to age In testimony
 Whereof I have here unto set my hand & fixt my Seal this 3^d Day
 of January Year of our Lord 1718

 by my Loving wife or my Ex^r here after named -

Item I Give and bequeath to my Loving Wife Elizabeth Gros all my Land
 whereon I now live for her life and after her Decease I give & planta-
 tion whereon I now live to my Son Francis Gros and the heirs of his
 body Lawfully begotten for ever of & Land beginning at & mouth of a
 small Creek or branch that parts of plantation where I now live to
 and of plantation where my father lived and so up the Road to
 branch to & head line all that part of my land I give to my Son
