begotten a Negro girl called Rose and in case my said daughter die without  
issue then to survivor or survivor<sup>s</sup> of such my children as aforesaid  
I give and bequeath unto my daughter Martha and her heirs of her body  
one Negro called Maria and in case she die without issue then to the survivor  
or survivor<sup>s</sup> of such my children as aforesaid  
I give and bequeath unto my daughter Florence and her heirs of her body  
lawfully begotten a feather bed and furniture and in case she die without  
issue then the said bed and furniture to go to and for my daughter Florence  
and in case she die without issue to come to the survivor or survivor<sup>s</sup> of such  
my children as aforesaidI give and bequeath unto my daughter Florence one feather Bed and  
furniture add to the heirs of her body lawfully begotten for ever and

Enjoying all such Legacies I have or shall leave him immediately after my

My Will and Desire is that all such stock of Cattle Horses and Mares and  
Sheep etc are to be found belonging to me to be equally divided between my  
Wife and Children —

My Will and Desire is that my aforesaid daughters have their Legacies  
paid them when they come to the age of sixteen or Married —

I John Harris of the upper part of Isle of Wight County in Virg: being sick and weak of  
Body but still in mind and memory thank God for it do make this my last Will  
and testament in manner and forme as followeth —

First and principally I give unto my three daughters Alice Elizabeth and Isabell  
three hundred acres of land lying in the Isle of Wight County at or near Coronowak —  
formerly giving the Blaugh Campbell the above said land I give to my three daughters  
and their heirs for ever to be equally between them —

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Alice the bed and all the furniture she comong  
her on and one Iron pott and books on spitt and brackets and one Pewt: tenn pounds  
of Pewter and three plates half New half Old and one Cow of six Years Old one  
sheaf of two years old

I give and bequeath unto my two Daughters Elizabeth and Isabell one bed the  
they commonly lie on w<sup>th</sup> all furniture as it now stands —

I give to my Daughter Elizabeth one Iron pott and books and ten pounds of Pewter  
and three plates and one Cow and one Sheaf —
