I give unto my Grandson William Shelton a Silver Tankard Cost 50^l

I give unto James Shelton my Grandson a Silver Tankard Cost 40^l as also 1000^l
100^l in the hands of Mr. Thomas Ridgely

I give unto my grand Daughter Sarah Shelton two thousand pounds 100^l in
the hands of Mr. Thomas Ridgely

It is my Desire that my Grandson Thomas Shelton may be a Trustee to see
Legacies given to his Brethren be paid
