Item - I give unto James Briggs Jun<sup>d</sup> son of James Briggs Sr<sup>d</sup> One hundred and  
so Anns of Land Bounding to George Stevens in the Isle of Wight Comprising  
Black water Commonly knowne by the Name of the Ford and to the heirs  
heires of his Body lawfully begotten and I the said James should Die next  
you shall to Edmond Briggs and his Liffull Spouse

Item - I give unto James Shelton my Grandson a Silver Tankard Cost £<sup>1</sup> as also 1000  
lbd<sup>d</sup> in the hands of Mr<sup>d</sup> Thomas Ridley

Item - I give unto my grand Daughter Sarah Shelton two thousand pounds lsd<sup>d</sup> in  
the hands of Mr<sup>d</sup> Thomas Ridley
