 Negroes remain in my Daughter Wilkinsons hands till my Granddaughter
 Comes of Age.
 - 2 I Give to my Granddaughter Martha Norworthy my Negro Girl Doll but
 if my Granddaughter Should die before Shee Come of Age then I Give the
 said Negro Doll to my Daughter Eliz: Wilkinsons and that the said Negro Girl
 Remain in my Daughter Wilkinsons hands till my Granddaughter comes
 of Age.
 - 3 I Give to my Daughter Eliz: Wilkinsons my Negro man Beavis and
 my Negro Maid Bees and the Male and Female of my Negroes
 going to my Daughter Wilkinsons during her Life and I Give the Negro
 Boy to my Son Joseph Goodwins Son Samuel for Ever -
 I Give to my Daughter Wilkinsons one Silver Tankard one Small Cup
 and half a Dozen of Spoones and a Large Salt Seller and a small tumbler.

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I give to my Daughter Patience Milner all y^e Rest of my Negroes that
is 2 Bikes one negro boy Soper one negro man Mingo Beck Catapegg
Charles.

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I give to my Daughter Milner y^e great Silver Tankard one Porringer
and halfe a Dozen Silver Spoons and y^e great Salt Soller

I give to my granddaughter Eliz^a Norworthy y^e Silver Sugar Box one
Silver plate one paper box halfe a Dozⁿ of Spoons and a Small Salt
Soller at her fathers & a Little Silver Tumbler

I give to my Granddaughter Martha Norworthy one Silver Porringer

I give to my Granddaughter Patience Milner Six Silver Spoons

I give to my Granddaughter Eliz^a Norworthy thirty Six Gunies one

Chest of Drawers y^e great Looking Glass Six Cane Chaires and
the Cane Couch one pair of Pillins & Vallins one feather Bed and
a Tugg and y^e Watch and halfe y^e Money that is in her fathers hand
I send to me

Pen and one Guny.

And after all my just Debts are payd I give all y^e Rest of my Estate to my
Daughters Equally betwixt my two Daughters & their Children as Wills
my hand and Seal this 5 Day of Aprill 1717

hundred and fourteen according to the Computation of the Church of En-
gland — I Thomas Underwood sen^r of the Isle of Wight County
in Virginia being weak and sick of Body but of perfect mind & memory

my last will & testament as follows: Imprimis —

Blessed Lord and Saviour to Receive Pardon and forgiveness of all my
Sins and for my Body I Recommend it to y^e Earth to be Buried in a
