 nient to settle and Dispose of that Little Estate of Land hath made
 me Steward of or Given me & being in good Sound memory I
 Do make this my Last will & Testament this first day of October
 in of year one thousand seven hundred & seven that is as follows with
 first I Give and bequeath unto my Dear & Loving wife Elizabeth Parker
 all of furniture of her Lodging Room except one Square Table and
 thirty five Shillings in Cash & one Iron Pot & further
 Give & bequeath unto my Daughter Martha Parker of best feather bed
 and furniture belonging to it that is in my house & one Large trunk
 & one small Grey Horse & one Spice Mortar & one Iron Pot
 Give & bequeath unto my Son Nicholas Parker a piece of Land I bought
 of Daniel Batting with all of Appurtenances therunto belonging to
 him & his heirs for ever & likewise give my Son Nicholas for
 private use to God any timber that he occasion of fuel for his plan-
 tation use of my Son Nathanaels Land both him & his heirs of his
 Body also I Give half of my house & Land in Hampton I Give to
 a Nicholas to him & his heirs for ever & Three young Cows
 Give & bequeath unto my Son Nathanael Parker the Land I now live
 on to him and his heirs for ever & the other half of my house and land
 at Hampton Town to him and his heirs for ever it is likewise my
 will & Desire that after my Just Debt are paid that of Remainder
 of my Estate should be Equally Divided in four parts my Wife & each of
 my Children Equall Share thereof & to be Divided by & Distribution of
 Pristram Norworthy senior I Do also appoint & constitute & ordain
 my Dear & Loving Son Nathanael Parker to be Whole Executor
 of this my Last will & Testament & to see full & In Witness here of I
 have here unto set my hand and fixed my Seal of Day & year above

 sent weak of Body but of sound memory Calling to mind the uncertain-
 ty of this present Life and knowing that all men must dye think fitt to
 make this my last will and testament to Dispose of all my worldly
 Goods and Estate as God has been pleased to bestow on me as followeth Com-
 mending my Soul to God & my Body to have a Christian buriall at the
 Discretion of Elders here after named

I Give unto my Dear & well beloved wife Elizabeth a Room well
 furnished with all such necessaries as shee shall Reasonably have
 occasion out of my Estate and to be kept so furnished by my Elders also
 I leave her three negroes During her natural life that is to say
 John Diner and Frank & also her Riding mare

I Give Equally between my two Sons William Scott and Robert Scott
 my water Mill to them and their heirs for ever also I do leave unto
 my son Wm if use of one third part of my orchard here named of his
 own

I Give unto my son John Scott all my tract of Land lying on the
