 give to God therefore Calling to Mind the Mortality of my and knowing here it is
 appointed for all men once to die to make and obtaine this my Last Will and Testament
 in manner and forme following that is to say First and principally I give my soul into
 the hands of God who gave it me and for my Body I Comend it to the Earth to be Buried
 in Christian and decent manner and Nothing doeing but at the Generall Buriall place where
 I shall be againe by the Mighty power of God an as touching such Wordly Estate
 as it hath pleased God to bestow on me in this life I give devise bequeath and Dispose the
 same in manner and forme following

- 1st I give and bequeath to my grandson Humphrey Leitch the one half of my Land in
 the Woods lying upon John Marshall to him and his heirs for Ever
- 2^d I give and bequeath to my Grandson Joseph Leitch the other half of my Land in the
 Woods to him and his heirs for Ever and that neither of my Grand Sons shall have any
 part in one or the other
- 3^d I give the Land as the point where Thomas Hill lives to my Daughter Mary Hill and her
 heirs for Ever
- 4th I give and bequeath the Land where I now Dwell to my grandson Thomas Applehead
 and his heirs for Ever
- 5th I give to my Loving Wife my Negro man Will and the Indian Woman Wai for Ever
- 6th I give to my Daughter Mary Hill my Negro man Peter and my Negro woman Marra
- 7th I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Anne Applehead my Negro boy Dick and little Sam
- 8th I give to my Daughter Sarah Leitch my Negro boy Joe and my Indian Maid Quia Rose
- 9th I give to my Wife three Cows a Saddle and the Choice of my horses in the case of her
 Death and if my Wife will Not stand to this my Will that shee shall have three Cows more and
 a Saddle to provide for the rest of my Estate

I Give and bequeath unto Sarah Thomas the Son of Elizabeth Thomas Sam^y Indian
Woman Moll and one two years old Mara it runs at the Point where on West lives
It Give unto Elizabeth Thomas ten pounds Sterling for the bringing up of the Son John
Thomas to be paid to her in goods all the first East in England or by Bills of Exchange
It Give to Sarah Thomas three Silver Spoons of the best sort and my Will is
that my Daughter Mary Hill have six acres of the plantation where I am line
and the upper town of the land in the West which I gave to my two grandsons
Leathins and as for the rest of my Estate to be Equally divided between my Wife
and my three Daughters Sarah Mary and Anne and in my Will that my place be
Equally divided as above said and that my Will be appraised to the value of my
Estate and that Sarah Leathins have the title in part of her share of my
Estate and that the rest of my Estate be appraised and that Every one to
have their share in kind according as it is appraised and of this my
Last Will I wish and ordain my well beloved Son John Henry my
and Cole Sam Bridges my full and whole Ex and I do hereby order
before reach and annul all and Every other former testament Will Legacies
bequeaths &c by me in any Way before this time made named willed and bequeaths
satisfying and Confirming this and no other to be my Last Will and
testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day
