lastly bequeath of his Body forever, and if it shall please God of his mercy, to call him to his mercy, then to settle his
w^t survivor,

From The grog bequakk unto my leving sonnes Thomas Stone and his wifes lawfully begotten of me, the firste sonne
of Edward Stone in possession, & all the land Belonging to it on that side of Sumner, to him & his affindes ever.

From 11 a.m. to 12 m. I hiked up the stream bed of the South Branch of the Susquehanna River, following its course upstream.
