The Last will and Testament of John Murro of the Isle of Wight County in
Virginia made the thirteenth Day of the first month Called March in the year
of our Lord 1718 -

I give unto wife a mare and Cart and Wholes & a horse Cart
I give unto my Daughter Prissella five hundred pounds of Tobacco to
be paid out in present and one Iron pot this present year the Tobacco
now being due in the Woods Bridge hands - I give unto the same
a horse of four year old - I give unto James Hall a horse of
four year old -

I give unto Peter Hall a young sow -

I give unto my Cousin Roger Murro a young sow -

I give unto my Brother Roger Murro my wear Jacket -

I give unto my Sister Ann all the Rest of my wearing Cloths -

I give unto my son in Law John Permonitor my Gun -

I give unto my son in Law James Permonitor a Dutch Iron pot of
about three gallons -

I give unto my wife Mary and my Daughter Prissella all my
Furniture what so ever after all my Lawfull Debts are paid -

I do also hereby make Oathhouse and appoint Robert Driver
to be Executor of this my Last will and Testament In Witness
Whereof I have to this my Last will set my hand and seal
the Day and year above Written -
