In the name of God Amen I Martha Allin being sick and weak but
 pray God be Given to God in full sound mind & memory & do hereby
 ordain this to be my Last will & last testament in manner and
 in followoeth; first I Give and bequeath my soul to god hoping in
 mercy and pardon of all my sins through Jesus Christ and as for
 worldly goods God hath Endued me with I Give in manner and form
 as followeth // I give and bequeath to my Daughter Martha Long
 three Shoppin Confirmation of what I have Given her already I Give
 & bequeath to my Daughter patene Kealley three Shoppin Confi-
 -mation of what I have given her I give unto Nicholas all none
 I Give & bequeath unto Thomas all in Gold one Cow I give and bequeath
 unto Thomas all in two Shillings Current Money I give unto
 Roger all in two Shillings Current Money and as for all of Rest
 of my Estate my Just Dobbts going paid I give to my son William Rutter
 and my son Allin to be Equally Divided between them according
 to the thereof and is my will and Desir of my Daughter Ann Allin and her
 Estate to Remain with my son Wm Rutter and if it shall please God
 that my Daughter Ann shall Depart this life before shee shall come
 to of age of twenty one or or of Days of marriage if in her part of
 Estate to wholly belong to my son Wm as aforesaid and I do hereby
 and appoint my son Wm Rutter to be my Exor of this my last will and
 Testament signed sealed and Declard to be of Last will & Testament of
 Martha Mellen (Maid)
