tion of my Executors here after named & as for my worldly effects
or goods of all sorts whatsoever or where so ever they are I
bequeath as followeth

first I Give to my Daughter ann Weston one mahr following
Item I Give to my Daughter Sarah Butler a heifer of two year old
Item I Give to my Daughter Elizabeth Parker a young grey horse for year
Item I Give to my Son William Smith a bull of three year old or a sheep of the
Item I Give to my Granddaughter ann Weston two Ewes Lambs
Item I Give to my two Sons Nicholas & Joseph Smith the two best that I now
lie on with the furniture therewith belonging
Item I Give to my Grandson will Smith a pair of pistols
Item I Give to my Grandson Peter Lugg two Ewes
Item I Give to my Grandson Nathaniel Parker two Ewes Lambs
Item I Give to my Son Nicholas Smith one Codd or Cheft
and all the rest of my Estate whatsoever or where so ever
within Doors or without I Give unto my four Children that
is to say nicholas Smith Joseph Smith ann Smith and Martha
Smith to be Equally Divided between them except my Slaves
which I Give to my two Sons nicholas and Joseph Smith and
my will is that my friends Will Green John Pitt & Henry Pitt
Divide the same according to their kind thereof and do well
Institute my Son Joseph Smith to be my whole Executor of
this my last will and testament as witness my hand this twenty
day of October one thousand seven hundred & fifteen
