

Nicholas Casey of the Lower parish of the Isle of Wight County in the County of Southampton that all I left a Borne to die and how soon or how long the same is unknowne I mean therefore I think it convenient to settle and dispose of that last Estate the Lord hath made towards of or given me I being in perfect Sense and Memory I do make this my last Will and testament this Seventeenth Day of April in the Year One thousand Seven hundred and thirteen as followeth

I give unto my Son Nicholas Casey the plantation that I have on page one of John Corbett New Court on the plantation that Burg Kings now Court on to my Son Thomas Casey Agreeing to it to them and their heirs for Ever to be Equally Divided between them but both to have a free Privileges in all the Marshes both then and their heirs for Ever but if either of my Sons Nicholas or Thomas Casey should Die without Issue then the Longest Liver to have both but if both should Die without Issue then to my three youngest Daughters to I had by my last Will and all the Land to I bought of Mr. Wm Bady I give and bequeath to for aforesaid Sons Nicholas and Thomas Casey to them and their heirs for Ever and if either should Die without Issue to the Longest Liver and if both Die without Issue to the three formentioned Daughters to I had by my last Will and to their heirs for Ever

I give to my Son Richd Casey my Wearing Coats
I give my Daughter Anne one Eve
I give to my Daughter Mary one Eve
I give to my Daughter Sarah one Cupboard two yards of cloth that I have thereon and one kee for 10 Cabb and after my last Will are paid I give the Rest of my Estate to my Loving Wife Jane Casey and my five youngest Children Martha Jane Eliza Nicholas and Thomas to be Equally Parted make and ordaine Constitute my Loving Wife Jane Casey and my Son Richd Casey my Ex^{ors} and Ad^{ors} of this my last Will and testament and to fulfill it in Witness hereof I have hereunto set my hand and first my seal the Day and Year Above Written
