From my property I give and bequeath to my Sister Disobed for Satisfaction for her Troubles & Care that she has had and then at for me one Black Walnut Table one little Bedstead & Brass Bedstead containing a Coat of Arms one powder Quart Tankard and four Cans and it is my will that she have her first Choice out of all my Sheep -

From my property I give and bequeath to Anne Chapman one Lamb

From my property I give and bequeath unto my Loving Brother William Goddard my Riding horse Bred to Sedgewick & the Saddle & Girth and my Great Looking Glass my Silver Tankard the feather Bed and furniture I used to go on one such half a Pair of Pairs

From my property I give & bequeath unto my Loving Brother William Goddard and my Loving friend Joseph Chapman all the Rest and Remaining part of my Estate both real & personal Equally to be Divided between them And I do make and ordain them to be Part of this my Will and to meet Consulting and making me and them all for more Wills by me made and Declaring this to be my last Will in Testimony Whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal the 19 day of Feb 1788

Richard Webb the Last will and Testament of William Goddard was presented by the Executors who made Oath there to & being proved by the Oaths of the Witnesses & admitted to Record So that the Light Book of the County of Westchester of the Estate of William Goddard deceased is as follows

Seven yoke of Hogs seven Sheep three feather Beds four Rugs  
Three pairs of Blankets one pair of Sheets one pair of one pillow
