- In the name of God I James F. W. Pitt of Newport High Isle of High County
being of perfect mind and memory Do hereby bequeath my last
will and testament in manner and form as followeth
- Item I give and bequeath my soul to Almighty God and hope through the merits of my
beloved Saviour Jesus Christ to have full pardon of all my sins and my body to be decently
buried by my Ex. Executor Marked
- Item I give and bequeath to my brother John Monroe my Negro Gals called Flor-
ence and all the other part of my Movable Estate to be Equally divided between my
three sisters Henrietta Monroe Sarah Monroe and Mary Monroe
- Item I give and bequeath to my brother James Pitt the plantation whereon Elizabeth
William was born and the plantation whereon John Fidge was born according to the
bounds of the plantation from the San pit Swamp strait to the corner of Cooks Road
land to him and the Male Heirs of his body for Ever and if he die without such Heirs
to my brother Henry Pitt and the Male Heirs of his body for Ever
- Item I give and bequeath to my father in law and Mother all the remaining part of
the dividend of Land which now they live on being twelve hundred acres
the Male Heirs of his body for Ever and also what more land Gert Beaton
and Bridget Cook and Sarahs live and if he die without such Heirs then his part
of my movable Estate to be Equally divided between my three sisters
before mentioned and his part of my Land to be Equally divided between my
three brothers John Pitt, James Pitt, and Henry Pitt and the Male Heirs of
their bodies for Ever
- Item I give and bequeath my whole right and title of the town Land as having
New Court any satisfaction for it to the use of the Church for a Place or site
Court and bury that think fit
- Item I give and bequeath the plantation whereon Susanah Mofrop now liveth and
the plantation whereon Markers Shaws now liveth according to the bounds of the
plantation and also the whole tract to him and the Male Heirs of his body for
Ever and if he die without such Heirs to my brother Henry Pitt and the Male Heirs
of his body for Ever
- Item I give and bequeath to my brother Henry Pitt all the remaining part of my
Land Situate on Pagon Cook to him and the Male Heirs of his body for Ever
all their heirs being lawfully begotten upon Condition that he do not
sell it for or remove twelve hundred acres of Land which have

already given, which if he is, then the said land to have given him I give to my
Brother John Morris in like manner and Henry Pitt die the same such heirs to be divided
Equally between my two backs before mentioned and their heirs in like manner
I give and bequeath to Mary Pitt the Daughter of Mr Thomas Pitt and to Elizabeth Bridge
the Daughter of Capt Joseph Bridge to each of them the sum of ten pounds Sterling to be
paid to them upon demand after Marriage or the age of Eighteen years out of the profits
of the lands to have given to my backe Henry Pitt to be paid by him or or them that shall
possess it

I give and bequeath to Mary mistress the Daughter of Thomas mistress and to Sarah
Watts the Daughter of John Watts to each of them the like sum and to be paid to them in like
manner by my backe John Pitt

I give and bequeath to Maria Morrisworth the Daughter of Mr John Morrisworth and to
Jane Smith Daughter of Capt Arthur Smith to each of them the like sum to be paid to
them in like manner by my backe James Pitt

I give and bequeath to my three sisters before mentioned to each of them four
hundred pounds too or the full value to be paid to them in like manner by my father
in Law Edward Morris

Do hereby revoke all former Wills and do make my father in Law Edward Morris
and my backe Henry Pitt my Ex^r of this my last Will and Testament as Witness my hand
and seal this 10th day of July 1711

the Mercy of Jesus Christ to receive pardon of my sins and my Body after this I divide parts
to be buried in the earth in a decent manner according to the direction of my Ex^r
and as for my worldly goods God hath blessed me with I give in manner as follows

I give to my Daughter Sarah Mackeone one young mare and a young doe and one small
Calf and I give to my Son W^m Mackeone one yoke and all my new iron Cloats & my
my hat and one pair of steeple brooches and I give to my said Son William a pair of
shoes and one new shoe and a small Cedar box

I give to my Son Neale Mackeone all my Cooper tools and my sword and belt and a halfpenny
bush grain and one new shoe

I give to my Son Peter Mackeone two Cowes one new shoe and one Calf

I give to my Son John Mackeone one pair of steeple brooches

I give to my Daughter Mary Whitty half a side of mutton and half a side of beef
Cattle and thereof to make it into shoes and as for all the rest of my Grace my last will
paid I give to my Wife Sarah my Daughter Ann and my Son Joseph Mackeone to divide
between them as they shall think as to and do nominate and appoint my Loving
Wife Sarah and my Son W^m Mackeone to be my Ex^r
