 sick & weak of body, but of good mind & perfect sense & memory, thanks be to Almighty
 God, calling to mind y^e uncertain state, of this transitory life, & y^e all flesh must yield
 to death w^{ch} it shall please God upon us: I doe therefore constitute, ordaine & declare
 this my last Will & Testament in manner & forme following. Revoking annulling, by
 these presents, all & every Testament & Testament with will, heretofore by me made, &
 declared, either by word, or writing & this to be taken only for my last Will & Testament
 & none other. And first being penitent & sorry from y^e bottom of my heart for my sins
 past, most humbly desiring forgiveness for y^e same. I give & bequeath my soul to
 Almighty God, my Saviour, & Redeemer, in whom by y^e precious merits, of Iesus Christ,
 I trust, & believe assuredly to be saved, & to have full remission & forgiveness of all my
 sins. & y^e my soul, w^{ch} my body all y^e goodall day of Resurrection shall rise againe
 wth joy: & through y^e merits of Christ's Death, & his precious passy & Inheritt y^e Kingdom of
 Heaven prepared for his elect & chosen. And my Body to be buried in such
 place, where it shall please my he^{er} hereafter named to appoint. And now for y^e
 settling of my Temporall Estate, & such goods, Chattels & debts as it hath pleased
 God (far above my deserts) to bestow upon me: I doe order, give & dispose of y^e same,
 In manner, & forme following (that is to say)

first I will y^e all those debts, & duties w^{ch} I owe in right, or conscience to any manner
 of person, or persons w^{ch}soever, shall be withy^e trustly contented & paid, or ordained to be
 paid, within convenient time, after my decease, by my he^{er} hereafter named.

Item I give & bequeath, my negroe boy, called Quomine, unto my God daughter,
 Rosella Scotkins, daughter of Tho^s Scotkins for every y^e negroe to be sold
 to her father, for her use, immediately after my decease.

Item I give & bequeath unto my Goddaughter Eliz^e White: daughter of In^t
 White, in y^e Lib of Wight County, my silver bands & ring given to be delivered to
 her immediately after my decease.

Item I give & bequeath unto my loving friend Tho^s Scotkin, my best riding
 horse called Dragon: & my Musk saddle, & bridle: to be delivered him immedi-
 ately after my decease.

Item I give & bequeath unto Tho^s Bay, son of my brother In^t Bay, & my kinswoman
 Honorilla Caroll, daughter of my sister Eliz^e Caroll in y^e Kingdom of Ireland
 the forty pounds sterling due to me, from my father in San^t Mi^s Francis Oboro
 there, y^e same to be equally divided, betwixt y^e s^r Thomas, & Eliz^e.

Item I give & bequeath unto my deare Dear, & loving wife, my White, during
 her naturall life, And after her decease to James Bay.

Item I give & bequeath unto my loving wife Martha, after all legacies, funerals
 expenses, & just debts paid, & deducted one half of all y^e remaining part, of my whole
 Estate, real, or personall w^{ch} I have here in Virg^e or els where.

Item I give & bequeath unto my loving friend Tho^s Gordon my silver haddo pin.

Item I give & bequeath unto my kinswoman Tho^s Bay & my kinswoman Honorilla
 Caroll, daughter of my sister, Eliz^e Caroll (in y^e Kingdom of Ireland) the
 remaining part, of my Estate, here in Virg^e or els where: to be equally
 divided betwixt them. (y^e s^r Thomas & Elizabeth.)

Item lastly

Know all men by these presents, that I Martha Boye, of the Isle of Wight County, widow of Thomas Boye, my loving friend, my whole, sole executrix of this my last Will & Testament, in Witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand this twelfth day of July
