 give & bequeath my soul unto y^e hands of Almighty God my Body to y^e Earth to be decent & Christianly
 & as for any other worldly goods or Estate now y^e I have in my hand has been pleased to lend unto me my
 Just Debts & funeral Expenses first paid I doe give & bequeath as hereafter followeth.
 I doe give & bequeath to my loving wife Elizth Joyner my plantation & hereon y^e now liveth during
 her natural life wth all y^e land & belonging to itt & after her decease to my son Thomas Joyner & his
 heirs for ever

- 1 I doe give to my eldest Daughter Christian y^e plantation whereon she now liveth During her life if she please to live upon it If not to returne to my eldest son Thomas Joyner & his heirs for ever.
- 2 I doe give & bequeath to my son Henry Joyner all y^e land lying between 10th Minutins bounds of y^e plantation where he lived & Arthur Purcells land to him & his heirs for ever.
- 3 I doe give & bequeath to Henry Joyner five hundred acres of land all y^e mouth of y^e branch called y^e dirty branch lying on each side of y^e branch to him & his heirs for ever.
- 4 I doe give to son James Joyner y^e plantation whereon 10th Minutins did live, & y^e plantation whereon Charles Kerckhoff did now live to him & his heirs for ever Both plantations as far as a great hollow y^e crosses y^e neck.
- 5 I doe give & bequeath to my youngest Daughter Martha Joyner y^e remaining part of y^e North from y^e 5th hollow together wth y^e plantation whereon y^e Widows father now lives to y^e outwards bounds of my land on y^e side to her & heres for ever.
- 6 I doe give to my son Ine Joyner y^e plantation whereon he now liveth to all my land on y^e north side of y^e fallen branch as far as a high branch y^e turns into y^e low ground & soe into Warok to him & his heirs for ever.
- 7 I doe give & bequeath to my son Nehemiah Joyner all y^e land on y^e other side of y^e first branch & all y^e land on y^e South side of y^e fallen branch That belongs to me, to him & his heirs for ever.
- 8 I doe give & bequeath to my son Thomas Joyner y^e plantation whereon he now liveth to all y^e land belonging to it y^e it is not already acknowledged to Thomas Williams to him & his heirs for ever.
- 9 I doe give & bequeath to my loving Wife A black mare called Nanny wth 6th bridle & saddle.
- 10 I doe give & bequeath to my loving wife A black mare called the Joyner my riding horse called the
- 11 I doe give to my daughter Martha a bay called Jimmy wth her whole furniture.
- 12 I doe give & bequeath to my daughter son Henry a p^{er} pale horse called spark & bridle & saddle
- 13 I doe give & bequeath to my son James A young horse called belonging to a gray mare & y^e mare I doe give to my son Nehemiah but if y^e 5th should dye my Will & desire is y^e my son Nehemiah but if y^e 5th should dye James shall have y^e next best y^e she brings.
- 14 I doe give to my grandson Thomas Joyner A bay mare filly
- 15 I doe give to my son Ine a bay horse y^e it called his a bay mare y^e Diphon & a young colt five horses, five yearlings, three steers, one two year old heifer, one white ewe & a black ewe lamb five sows wth piggs & four black hogs one box of spindles & needles & one sword.
- 16 I doe give to my son Lucy Joyner one heifer & colt.
- 17 I doe give to my Dear Wife one feather bed & furniture.
- 18 I doe give to my son James one feather bed & it belongs to it.
- 19 I doe give to my son Nehemiah one feather bed & furniture.
- 20 I doe give to each of my three daughters Christian, Elizabeth & Deborah five shillings apiece
- 21 I leave all my Tools Carpenters, Coopers & Tanners to all my children to me as they have occasion as long as they last, but this house where I now live to be theirs from y^e this day may know where to fetch y^e wth they want y^e.
- 22 My Will & Desire is y^e all y^e best of my moveable Estate of re. nature or quality soe or within doors or out to be equally shared in five parts or part to my loving wife & y^e other four parts to my four children Henry James, Nehemiah Martha, each to take y^e part in kind att y^e age of sixteen. I nominate constitute & appoint my 5th loving Wife Elizabeth of this my last Will & Testament I doe here by renounce all former Wills or Testaments or deeds & conveyances by me made either by word or writing & shall by & confirmed

my next of kin after named, and touching J disposition of all such Temporal Estate, as it hath
pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me, I give & dispose thereof as followeth, first I will
that my debts & funeral Charges shall be paid & discharged, Item I give unto my loving wife
one fourth part of my Estate, & pillow one half Blanket & one sheet & God send our souls -
Thus & my Box & a Mass,

I give to my Son John Baldwin all my Shop of Tools in Anson, & a hunting sword, after
the coming of Age, I make him of age at Eighteen years and if his mother marry not else

I give all my Land unto my Son Benjamin Baldwin & his heirs of his body lawfully begotten
of his body for ever, and if he die without heirs then the Land to fall to my daughter Jane only -
my loving wife to have one half of J Land during her life, and all the rest of my personal
Estate I give between my wife & four Children, that is to say, Jane Mary Sarah & Prudent -
and I do make my loving wife my whole & sole Exr of this my last will & Testament, in
