ther & one Ram & do Desire him to take them as they come young and old
together & I do give and bequeath to my Grandson ten Shillings in Stere-
mony of Eng Land. - and I do Give and bequeath make over bind and con-
firm unto even Dror of St Dorset of Dorset County to him his heirs
Executors Administrators or Assignes of whole mogety or per cell of Land belon-
ging to me bounding as if ancient marke trees Directs upon if pay ment
of thirty pounds Sterling money of Eng Land then to be Delivered in-
turnff and Trigg now the Legacies being paid of I do give and make
over to my beloved wife Elizabeth all of Rest of my Estate both with
in Doors and without to Dispose of as shee shall think fitt and I do or-
dain my beloved wife Elizabeth my Whole and Sole Executrix and
this I do ordain as my Last will and Testament as Witness hereunto
