Iron and heater a Looking Glass two horses and one Mare and a parcel of

County being in perfect mind and memory thank to almighty God  
for the same but feeling to mind the uncertainty of this mortal life  
and transitory Life do therefore make and ordain this my last  
will and testament in manner and form following Revoaking  
and here by utterly Disannulling all and Every former will and  
will Testament or Testaments and this on behalf and or other  
whatsoever to be taken Assumed and held to be my last will and  
Testament and first and principally I bequeath my soule to God  
that gave it and my body to the Earth from whence it was  
taken to be buried in a Christian manner according to the Dis  
cretion of my Executors hereafter named and as for what wa  
rily good the God of his mercy hath bestowed upon me I give  
Devise bequeath and dispose of in manner and form following  
after a just Sable and funeral Charge are fully satisfied  
and paid

I give and bequeath unto my Port Parries in the Jfles of Wight  
County the parish that I live in for a Globe for ever more four  
hundred acres of land that lies between the branch or Swamp  
that is on the west side of my now Proceeding house and

290 and the Penn Swamp being the upper part of the Land that Joyneth the  
Pagnosa and John Bernols Land and to the Parish of Newport  
and to the Successors and Ministers of the said Parish for Ever

Now I give and bequeath unto my loving Wife During her natural life all  
the Land and Plantation that I now Live on and what Land may be left  
when the four hundred Acres for the Globe is taken and after my loving wi-  
-fes Decease unto John Smalley and Thomas Smalley Sons of Robert Smalley  
and their heirs for Ever Equally to be Divided between them and if ei-  
-ther of them Dy without heirs of their Body that his part shall go to Ro-  
bert Smalley Son of Robert Smalley and if either or both of them shall  
Survive I should Dy without heirs of their Bodies his or their part  
shall go and Remain unto Giles Smalley and his heirs - -

Now I give and bequeath unto Lewis Smalley and his heirs for Ever all my Land on  
the South Side of Blackwater Swamp - - - - -

Now I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Eleanor the use of all my Negroes  
Tom Phis & Moll During her natural life and in Case my said wife  
Should be in want that then she hath full power to sell and dispose all  
the said Negroes for Ever but in Case my said wife Doth not sell or Dispose  
of them in her life time that then my Negroes I give unto Robert Smalley  
and his heirs and my Negroes Tom and Moll to Lewis Smalley and his heirs  
for Ever the said Lewis making over all his Right to his Brother Robert  
that in a Negro Tombo on the profession of the said Negroes Tom and Moll -

Now I give unto Eleanor Smalley one Diamond Gold Ring - - - - -

Now I give unto John Smalley my little Gun that his father has Robert Smalley

Now I give unto Lewis Smalley my pistols holsters Samitor Carbine brose plate  
and furniture - - - - -

Now I give and bequeath unto my loving wife all the rest of my Effels Goods  
and Chattels what so ever that is not already given and bequeath unto my  
said wife and her disposing for ever and I do hereby nominate Condi-  
-tute and ordain my loving wife my whole and sole Executrix of this my last  
will and Testament as Witness to my hand and seal this second day of Aprill  
one thousand seven hundred and fifty four
