after all Just Debts and funerall Charges are fully paid
and payd

I give and bequeath unto now Port Parcish in the Isle of wight
County the parish that I live in for a Glebe for ever more for
hundred acres of land that lies between the Branch or Swain the
thats on the west side of my road Proceeding towards and

59^o and the Corn Swamp being the upper part of the Land that doth extend to the
Paguosa and to the Pernol's Land and to the Parish of New York
and to the Successors and Ministers of the said Parish for ever

Now I give and bequeath unto my loving Wife During her natural life all
the Land and Plantation that I now have and what land may be left
when this four hundred Dollars for the Glass is taken and after my loving wife
is Dead and unto John Smeay and Thomas Smeay Sons of Robert Smeay
and their heirs for ever Equally to be Divided between them and if
either of them Die without heirs of their Body that his part shall go to Ro-
bert Smeay Son of Robert Smeay and if either or both of them be
Survivor, should Die without heir of their Body his or their part
shall go and Remain unto Peter Smeay and his heirs - - -

Now I give and bequeath unto Lewis Smeay and his heirs for ever all my land on
the South Side of Blackwater Swamp - - -

Now I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Eleanor the use of all my Negroes
and Molls During her natural life and in @fany time she may die for
should be in want that then she hath power to have and dispose all
the Land negroes for ever but in @fany case wife Doth not sell or dispose
of them in her life time that then my Negro Servants Robert Smeay
and his heirs and my Negro Tom and Moll to Lewis Smeay and his heirs
for ever the said Lewis making over all his Right to his Brother Robert
that is a Negro tomb on the profession of the said Negroes to me and Moll

Now I give unto Eleanor Smeay one Diamond Gold Ring - - -

Now I give unto John Smeay my little Gun that his father has Robert Smeay
and gives unto Lewis Smeay my pistol, holster, Simitor or bim brot & plate
and furniture - - -

Now I give and bequeath unto my loving wife all the rest of my Estate good
and Chattels whatsoever that is not already given and bequeathed to my
said wife and her disposing for ever and I do hereby nominate Estate
to my and my loving wife my whole and sole Effect of this my last
