Thomas & Benjamin Collier, now dwelinge, from which land containing two hundred & fifty acres, doth now or by
the all hereinafter Richards Woods & underwoods & appurtenances thereto belonging, during the said Mary's natural life
& after her decease.

2. I give & bequeath to my god daughter Mary the daughter of Henry & Mary Baker, all the above bequeathed land and
appurtenances to have her heirs for ever.

3. I give & bequeath to my wife, that all my land & that part of Land wherein I dwelt (that is to say) plantation
that Edward & Anne Brown were dwelinge containing three hundred & fifty acres, but more or less, & thitheron
Richards Woods & underwoods & appurtenances thereto belonging, to be sold forever by my Executor named,
and money so sold to be paid to Land shall be sold for the benefit of England, & thereof produce to again returned
to Eng. in good goods, such goods to be distributed & disposed of to such poor persons & property belong to a trust
in the Upper parish of this County, as my Executor named shall think fit & necessary

4. I give & bequeath to Eliza both the wife of Hugh Adey, her heires named here, & etc.

5. I give & bequeath to my god daughter Mary the daughter of Henry & Mary Baker, also to Richard Parker

6. I give & bequeath to James Thomas, twenty four shillings over

7. I give to Ann Chapman of West of Charles Chapman, & his three sons, sume shillings apiece, or by rule of them

8. I give & bequeath all of rest of my estate to Henry Baker, and doth hereby make Constitut & appoint him the
9. Trustee, my true wife to this my last Will & Testament, & making full record, & witness therunto made
10. & cause him to be my true Trustee, whereat I have written & put my hande, on the sevnd day of October

goods, of all I have & enjoy within doors & walls after my just debts being paid
2. I give & bequeath to my only daughter Sarah Bentley, one third of all my personalty totale, wherewithal to be
my daughter to bear her proportionable parts of all debts or charges that shall or may arise, by reason of
by reason of this my last will & Testament, As witness my hand & seal this 14th day of March 1705/6

At the name of God Amen, I James Jones husband of the wife of Wight County, now being in a very weak condition by sickness
but thank Almighty God, at this time in perfect sound memory do make this my last Will & Testament in manner & forme
as follows, first I commend my soul unto my only maker & controller God alone, and my body for to be decently buried
in my Buriall Land belonging to my children

2. I give & bequeath unto my sonne John Jones that plantation where he now liveth on, by estimation Three hundred & ariars
of Land, being purchased as thus, forst One hundred acres of Edmund Palmer, & One hundred of John Parker & and One
hundred acres of Henry Martin, I say I give & bequeath this aforementioned land unto my sonne John Jones, to
have & to hold the same of his Body, lawfull Begottell, by his Body, But if he should please God this my sonne John Jones should
leave but any other place, then for to fall to my sonne Abraham Jones, & his Heires lawfull Begottell of his Body

3. I give unto my sonne John Jones one fother bed & Bedster, and such bedding as shall be fit when I dye
also I give unto my sonne John Jones, Six pewter dishes, a Pewter platter & two porringers, also I give him
one Pewter Tankard, one Copper one, three dog of Pewter spoones also the best of my Pewter Table Crockery
& one dog of Pewter, also one Bras, Pewterish & one iron spit, one iron pott of about three gallons, & one
iron pan, one iron pot of one year Old, also I give him half of his Hedges, that shall then be inform the
plantation where he now liveth where place God I shall dye.

4. Then I give unto my sonne John Jones his three children to say, Joseph Jones, John Jones & Anna Jones, One to each
because John Jones has now in his possession, the three houses for to keepe for the good of my three grandchildren
I doe make appoynt, that of invienges that should be done for the good of my three grandchildren, according to my sonne
John Jones his distribution & the appoynt for to be had out in householde for his three children when they shall come to age
Also I give & bequeath unto my three grandchildren each of them, one young Heffier, neither to be under One year
old, the invienges of the said Heffiers for to be done for the best advantage for my three grandchildren
5. Then I give unto my daughter Anna Barnes, her stony weareing clothes, all my drests both Queen & Cullen, for to
her from the two Heffiers

6. Then I give unto my sonne Abraham Jones all & my remaining part of my estate that I shall dye seised of and after
his decease also for his lawfull Begottell Children of his Body, And if that my sonne Abraham Jones should dye
without children, then for to fall to my sonne John Jones, also in like manner (that is to say) If my sonne
John Jones his children should dye lawfull Begottell Children then for to fall to my sonne Abraham Jones, and if
my sonne should battye without any such children, then for to fall to my daughter Anna Barnes, Children
