In the Name of God amen I William Mayo Son of the
Lower parish of the Isle of Wight County in the year of our
Lord God 1713 According to the Impostation of the Church of
England Being Sick weak of Body but in perfect Senes
memory praised be to God for it I do make and ordain this my
Last will and Testament in manner and form as follows
I Impowring I Bequeath my Soul into the hands of God that Gave it my
maker Hoping that through the meritorious death and passion of
Jesus Christ my Saviour and Redeemer to Receive free pardon of
all my sins and as for my Body to be buried in a Christian burial
all the Discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned
I Give and bequeath unto my Son William Mayo all my Land
Lying on the East Side of Netterway Swamp to him and the heirs
of his Body Lawfully Begotten and for want of Such heirs then
to James Mayo and the heirs of his Body as aforesaid and for
want of Such heirs to the next heirs at Law

I Give unto my Son James Mayo one Neck of Land that is called
the Broad Neck beginning at Edward Goddons former tract running
a long the line out to the Rabbin Swamp or branch then down
the Swamp or Branch unto Netterway Swamp and so to include the
aforesaid Neck of Land to him and the heirs of his Body Lawfully
begotten and for want of Such heirs then to Return to William
Mayo and the heirs of his Body as aforesaid and for want of Such
heirs then to the next surviving heir at Law

I Give unto my Son John Mayo one Neck of Land lying on the
west Side of Netterway Swamp beginning at a live Oak a corner
there in Netterway Swamp so running the various Courses of the
Patent to Peter Branch and down the said branch to
Netterway Swamp and up the Swamp to the aforesaid
live Oak to him and the heirs of his Body Lawfully begotten
and for want of Such heirs then to be Peter Mayo and the
heirs of his Body Begotten as aforesaid and for want of
heirs to the next surviving heir at Law

I Give and Bequeath unto my Son Peter Mayo all the
Land on Netterway Swamp lying between the aforesaid branch
Peter Branch and the Rabbin Branch to him and the heirs of
his Body Lawfully begotten and for want of
then to Return to John Mayo and the heirs of his Body as aforesaid

5. I Give to my Loving wife Isabella Maye that plantation where
I now dwell to her during her natural life
6. I Give to my youngest Daughter Mary Maye my manor plantation
after her Mother's Death for Ever
7. I Give to my Son Peter Maye all my Land from Dumps King's Road
Branch to Brimstone Gaps his Life to him and his heirs for Ever
8. I Give and bequeath the three hundred Sixty and Six Acres of Land
Lying on King's Road and the Beaver Dam Swamps to my Son
John and my Daughters Margaret and Patience to be Equally
Divided to them and their heirs for Ever
9. as to my personal Estate
I Give unto my Son William Maye my Horse as me well Eight
Head of Cattle three Young Cows and three Horses going on three
years old and two Steers of three years old and one Steer of six
years old & four or five Dish and a pointer plow all new with one
Bed and one Iron Pot and five hundred pounds of Tobacco
10. I Give to my Son James one Horse Colored horse going on of four
years old and a Silver Tankard and one Gun of Dogies it all
Leaves to him
11. I Give to my Son John one young horse going on of three years
old and the Rod that I lay on and a Gun the Gun to be both
well fixt out of my Estate I give it as a Legacy
12. I Give to my Son Peter one young horse going on of two years old
and as for the Rest of my worldly Estate after my last will and
my funeral Charges paid I give and bequeath to be Equally
Divided between my Loving wife Isabella Maye and my six other
Children as followeth James Maye John Maye Peter Maye Mary
Maye Patience Maye Mary Maye who unite I Do and all and
Constitute my Loving Wife Isabella Maye and my Brother Bridg-
man Joyner who is Executor to this my last will and Testament
Revolving all other will or wiles before made I give to my Son
James one Iron Pot holding about four Gallons I give to my
Son John one Iron Pot holding about three or four Gallons my
home and Raser I give unto my Son William Maye I give those
Legacies At Witness my hand and Seal this 14th July
