

In the name of God Amen the fourteenth day of April 1707 I John Parks being in perfect mind & memory do make this my last will & testament in manner & form as followeth first I give & bequeath my soul into the hands of Almighty God my Creator, Father of a joyful Resurrection the I desire of my only & dear Jesus Christ in whom I hope for salvation, my Body I leave to my Father to be buried at the discretion of my wife, as shall be hereafter named, I doo dispose of my worldly Estate as followeth

I give & bequeath to my son John Parks One Shilling besides a pence I gave him formerly

I give & bequeath to my son Thomas Parks One Shilling besides a pence I gave him formerly

I give & bequeath unto my daughter Susannah One Shilling besides a pence I gave her formerly

I give & bequeath unto my son George Parks One Little Iron pot & two bowls & two hangings, One Bell, one spoon, one fork, One Iron Spitting stick, two deep dishes, One Dishon, One Iron pot, One set of Iron hangers, One small Tassell One Feather bed, One Bed & furnishing & three Courts & Cloves

I give & bequeath unto my loving wife Jane, all that of my personal Estate, besides what I have already given I doo also give unto my wife, all my land during her natural life, And after her decease, I doo give & bequeath all my landed land, to my son George Parks to him & his heirs for ever

I doo Ordain appoint my loving wife Jane Parks, before my wife's decease of this my last will & Testament, In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand, & fixed my seal, the day & year first above written

Reserving all other better to befall either by word or writing

- I give to my Son John Hosworth, halfe my Trust of Land lying in the City of Bristol County, & I offer halfe to my Son Peter Blake, to have & their Heirs lawfully begotten of their Bodies for ever, & for want of either such Heirs to fall to my Son Thomas Hosworth Son of my Brother George Hosworth, decessed to him & his Heirs lawfully begotten of his Body for ever, & for want of such Heirs to my Son Martha Hosworth, daughter as eldest of my Brother,
- I give to my Son Peter Blake my Red & Bonelton
- I give unto my Son Martha Hosworth, daughter of my Brother George Hosworth decessed One Negro Girl named Jane to have & their Heirs of her Body lawfully begotten for ever
- I give to my Son Martha Hosworth halfe my Little & halfe my Sheep the other halfe to be divided, betwixt my Son George Hosworth, & Peter, only one small Horse I give to my Son George Hosworth, Son of my Brother
- I give to my Son Martha Hosworth Six Silver spoons, & Six to my Son Martha Hosworth, daughter of my Brother, One Silver Tassell to my Son John Hosworth, & One Tassell to my Son John Hosworth, and the rest of my goods I doo
- I give to my Son John Hosworth & John Hosworth daughter of George Hosworth decessed
- I give to my Son George Hosworth that is now in England my Horse & furniture

And the rest of my Estate after my debts is p^d to be equally divided between my Brother George Norwichey & I
 I Constitute & appoint my Bro John Norwichey my whole & sole Ex^r of this my last will & Testament In which order
 I have set my hand & put my seal this day & year above written

 minority. And y^e I desire that what Estate I have to be equally divided amongst y^e
 And I doe desire & make James Sampson & George Piland my lawful Executors to
 see y^e this my last Will & Testament, & if they see y^e my will is not y^e formed I doe desire
 my two loving friends to take my son John's Estate their hands & equally divide my Estate
