and Testament of Robert Burnett

In the Name of God Amen This being my last Will and Testament first I bequeath  
my soul to god that gave it and my body to be buried in the Earth from whence it came  
and all my other Estate and goods as followeth  
Item: Firste being very sick and weak of body but of perfect memory and sense do  
here make my Will as followeth and doe ordaine and desire George Hardy senior to be my  
Exequit<sup>t</sup> to see each have their right and have equal  
Item give and bequeath unto my four children alike of all my temporall Estate to be divided  
amongst them every one of them an equal portion of all my Estate and goods but to  
Mary I give and bequeath one heifer which is to be the inheritance of Mathew Jones beside her  
equal share with the other children my cattle being eight in number that stands one  
young bull two cows and two yearlings eight barrows sixe sows and fourteen piggs  
Twenty eight hogsh<sup>t</sup> piggs being all my stocke to divide equally betwix them after my debts  
are satisfied and with the which I desire may be first done

Item I give all my household goods unto my four children alike being two beds the one a feath<sup>r</sup>  
bed with furniture the other a flock bed and his furniture two chests with twelve drawers  
dishes with all the other of my goods and that if either of my children die then I have  
granted devide amongst theire survivors

Item I give and bequeath unto Henry Wheeler son John the first Cow Calf that is Colled G  
having three pots a frying pan one skillet one pan of sheets April the 22 1679  
Item I give unto my sonne John my bille: Item I give and bequeath unto Mrs Mary Hardy my  
daughter and sonne she be senten<sup>t</sup> years of age and then to  
set free without lett or hindrance Item I give and bequeath unto Mrs Mary Hardy my  
daughter and sonne she be senten<sup>t</sup> years of age and then to be set free without lett  
or hindrance in witness whereof we have hereunto sett our hands and seals of this present  
instant month April the 22 1679
