Anthony Fulgham, being Sick and weak in Body but in perfect Mind
and Memory, first I give my Soul to God from whom I received it,
being in True and Certain Hope of a glorious Resurrection, in Jesus Christ
my Redeemer, and my Body I Commit to the Earth from whence it came
and as for my worldly goods I bequeath as followeth
I give and bequeath my Land I now live on unto my Brother Nicholas
Fulgham and to the Heir male of his body lawfully begotten; and if
he doth dye without Heir male, then the Land I give to my Brother
Michael Fulgham, and to the Heir male of his Body lawfully begotten, and in
case he doth dye without Heir male then I give my Land unto my
Brother John Fulgham son of Anthony Fulgham, and in case that he doth
dye without Issue then the Land to returne to the Heir male Children
of my Brother Nicholas Fulgham, and in case he doth dye without Issue
then the Land to returne to my Brother Michael Fulgham, and the
Heir male of his Body lawfully begotten
I give unto my Kinswoman Martha Fulgham Daughter to my Brother
Michael Fulgham to her and her Heir of her body lawfully begotten One
Hundred Acres of my Land which is adjoining to the Land of William
Peters
and as for my goods it is Remayning in the House it is my Will that
my Dear Brother Enjoy it during his life time, with what Crop is now
made to be disposed by him for the purchasing of Parents or other mine
as hee shall thinke fit with what Mine I have in Richard fence at home
to his like wis, & after his decease then my goods to be divided
between my Brother Nicholas and Michael Fulgham
and all the House and Manors which doth belong to me I give them unto my Sons,
thats Michael and Nicholas Fulgham, to be divided between them, and so
likewise my Castle I give to them to be divided
I give unto the Children of my Brother John Fulgham five Cows which is one
piece for them, with their Hens as is directed to be delivered unto them
at the discretion of my Brothers

And after the said division was made of the said land the Remainder of my estate to be equally divided between my Brothers Michael and Nicholas Fulgham and for what parts the said land belongs to which is undisposed of, likewise give to my Brothers Michael and Nicholas Fulgham the said equally divided share of the said land and make my Brothers Michael and Nicholas Fulgham my Executors to the this my Will performed as Witness my hand this 12th of October 1678
