and my Savior and Saviour and my body to the Earth from whence it came to埋 in  
that earth and as for my worldly Estate as followeth.

Item I Bequeath unto my sonne Thomas Hallman the land and plantation wher on he may  
dwelleth with the land belonging thereto which have already given him by deede of gift which is  
not yett Confirmed by the Court alerly confirmed to him his heires Executors Administrators  
or assigns for ever

I Bequeath unto my sonne William Hallman all my land which lyeth betwene the land  
that I gave to my sonne Thomas Hallman and William Gualtnys line to him his heires  
Excut<sup>t</sup> Administrat<sup>r</sup>s or assigns for ever

I also give unto my sonne Christopher Hallman the land where he hath now built & cleane  
with all buildings and fencys belonging to him his heires Execut<sup>r</sup>s Administrat<sup>r</sup>s or assigns for ever

I likewise give unto my sonne Richard Hallman my Cobens house and sufficient ground for  
his selfe which lyeth adynging or near to the said house either Gleant or to the side with  
fences and围d<sup>r</sup>ds of timber and stone and more ground if he haue occasion

I give unto my two daughters Anna Oliffon and Mary Oliffon each of them one two &

I also give and bequeath unto my two sons Christopher Hallman and Richard Hallman  
all the rest of my land with houses fencys orchards woods and appurtenances to be equally diuided  
for quantity and quality to them them in their executors Administrators or assigns after  
the death of my wife Mary Hallman

I doque all unto my wife Mary Hallinan my plantation and land during her life only which  
is decked with like houses orchards, fence, and buildings after her death give all my goods and chattels to  
Innumerable and Cable longs, Horses, hounds, or what else I am now possessed with all and sundry  
Belonging to my wife Mary Hallinan my whole and sole Executing of this my last Will and Testament  
Witness my hand this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of April in the year of our Lord 1691.

The last Will and Testament of Francis Giles of the Lower parish of the Isle of Wight  
County being nowise in body but in perfect intent and memory  
firstly giving my soul to god ever longing and my body to the earth to be decently buried  
in hope of a joyfull resurrection and as for my worldly goods I dispose of as followeth  
To my daughter Judith Newsworthy one graine Brasse Kettle that may hold two hundred or less  
pint gallons and one new drayning iron one flagon six Pewter plates and a Pewter cup  
other Pewter and one plate one yel of oxen to be delivered to her next of kin Comptur  
months wherewer her selfe is due to her out of her late fathers estate and thereafft give and bequeath  
all unto her

I give my sonne John Giles one young Rooffe which his grandfather left him fourteene pounds with all  
or Calent by him selfe, and two pair with a yoke and a goodough shoen one fable bed with  
boulders bedding Chapman of blackkites and paire of sheets with a set of steggs Curtains and Ballins  
one chesk one Gun fourteene Punds and a Rose and two basons of two yeare old ale and fourteene  
basons of two yeare old ale and two pair of sixty pence dials and two basons of one booke and one pair  
back and drinking. Two brass candle sticks one bright with an anchor two brass peals  
and six plates all whereof I give unto my sonne John Giles my Indian boy Ditch to be alie  
and to my sonne when he is at age of liming; and in the mean tyme to remaine in my sonne  
Twistern Newsworthy possession and fourteene hundred and fifty pounds of tobacco yearly till he come  
of age

Also giving my daughter Francis Hodges ten shillings in money and to her Eldest daughter Frances How  
sonne giving my daughter Francis Hodges ten shillings to her as soon as she laid hands thereupon by her selfe  
ten one young shewe to be delivered to her as soon as she laid hands thereupon by her selfe  
for me to my daughter Elizabeth Bridger to the value of five thousand pounds of tobacco out  
of my Estate to be paid at two payements in two years

and further by ordinance and appoint my sonne Christopher Newsworthy my sole Executor and  
to seeke his my Will performed and for any part of my Estate which is binded out of after my death  
paid to give unto my sonne Christopher Newsworthy my Executor as witness my hand and seal  
this fifteene day of May 1691
