In the name of God I Christopher Halliman being very sick and weak of body for
of perfect memory doe make this my last Will and Testament. Committing my soule to Christ
Jesus my saviour and redeemer and my body to the earth from whence it came to be buried in
that manner and as for my worldly Estate as followeth

I Bequeath unto my sonne Thomas Halliman the land and plantation whereon he now
dwelleth with the land belonging thereto which I have already given him by deed of gifts which is
not yett Confirmed by the Court alwhich I Confirme to him his heires Executors administrators
or assigns for ever

I Bequeath unto my sonne William Halliman all my land which lyeth betwene the land
that I gave to my sonne Thomas Halliman and William Gualtneys land to him his heires
Executors administrators or assigns for ever

I also give unto my sonne Christopher Halliman the land where he hath now built & cleared
with the buildings and finets belonging to him his heires Executors admis^r or assigns for ever

I like wise give unto my sonne Richard Halliman my Tobacco house and sufficient ground for
his use which lyeth adjoining or next to the said house either the east or the west with
finets and priviledges of timber and clearing more ground if he have occasion

I give unto my two daughters Anne O'Kiffon and Mary O'Kiffon each of them one ewe
also I give and bequeath unto my two sons Christopher Halliman and Richard Halliman
all the rest of my land with houses finets orchards woods and appurtenances to be Equally di-
vid for quantity and quality to them their heires Executors administrators or assigns after
the death of my wife Mary Halliman

I bequeath unto my wife Mary Hallman my plantation and land during her life only which is bounded with her house and orchard, forest, park, and garden, I bequeath unto her all my goods, movable and immovable, and Cattle, hogs, Hens, Rabbits, or what else I am now possessed with all and sundry. I do make my wife Mary Hallman my whole and sole executrix of this my last Will and Testament. Witness my hand this 21st day of April in the year of our Lord 1691.

The last Will and Testament of Francis Giles of the lower parish of the City of Wright County being in writing in body but not perfect in sense and memory

first I give my soul to God who has given it me and my body to the earth to be decently buried in hopes of a joyful resurrection and as for my worldly goods I dispose of as followeth

To my daughter Judith Norwosworthy one graine of Brass like that may hold twenty or eight pint gallons and one new dripping pan one flagon tip Turkey leather shaver, six ewes, and for other things and one white one yoke of oxen to be delivered to her next October Comewell months which part hereof is due to her out of her late fathers estate and the rest I give and bequeath unto her

I give my son John Giles one young horse which his grandfather left him fourty pounds with all or Calves by him, sadds, and two oxen with a yoke and a good plough, I give his father bid with a Boulter bucket, a pair of blankets and pair of sheets with a little of Hogg, Cuckoos and Ballnet one chest one Gun four ewes and a ham and two pounds of two years old butter and four barrels of two years old butter by six up with dishes and two basons of one sort and one earthen dish and drinking Cup, two brass candle sticks one brass pottle and more as two brass pates and six up with plates, all which I give unto my son John Giles my Indian boy Ditch to be delivered to my son when he is at age of living, and in the mean time to remain in my son's Trustee Norwosworthy possession and four hundred and fifty pounds of tobacco yearly till he come of age

I give my daughter Francis Rogers ten shillings in money and to her eldest daughter Frances Rogers one young horse to be delivered to her as soon as the said mare hath brought by her Colt I give unto my daughter Elizabeth Bridger to the value of five thousand pounds of tobacco out of my estate to be paid at two payments in two years

and I do hereby ordain and appoint my son Christram Norwosworthy my sole Executor and to see this my Will performed and for any part of my estate which is undisposed of after my death paid I give unto my son Christram Norwosworthy my Executor as Witness my hand and seal this fifteenth day of May 1691
