I promise I bequeath my soule into the hands of Almighty God, my Savio: & redeemer and my body
to the earth to be decently interred / And for my worldly goods my just debts beinge first
paid, I dispose of as followeth / Item I give to my Kinsman Robt: Bourchier two Cowes
wh: ralph, an: gray scardge stede, & a pair of gray stede Travars, one said travars to have
and a cloth roade, of fitt hatt, a pair of shorte Cluckings & a shirt; And to be free from any
service after my decesse, and in case my said Kinsman d: when I y: v a day after my decesse
then th: Cowes, in boves said, to returne to my daughter Elizabeth Bourchier /
Item I give to Hodges Comynell the younger, a heffter of two years old, & he: vantaged wth his famili
mens: / Item I give William th: form: of William Thrift a Cowe ralph,
Item I give unto my form: in lawe, George Williams my gray cloth Cloake, my giles Northolt and
my hande, / Item I give to Mary the daughter th: Daughter of William Thrift a Cowe ralph
Item I give Elizabeth Mynor th: Daughter of John Mynor a Cowe ralph /
Item I give to Elizabeth Davis th: Daughter of John Davis Dresed, a Cowe ralph /
Item my will is, that all th: legacies above except to be paid in ordre wth the first remembraunce
after my decesse / Item I give to the poorest people, in this parish to be distributed as
amongst them such as my ob: ser: sors herafte Nominate, shall think fit, on: esp: remem-
brance thereof: wth a good loape of bread to each of th: poore people abovesaid /
Item I give to my daughter Elizabeth Bourchier, all my land, howes, goods, & chattells, moveable or
immoveable, or debts of, what nature or quallite so: ever they bee, or wh: soeuer they shall remaine
or be found, to her & her heirs for ev: r, and in case of th: death of my said daughter Elizabeth
before sh: marry or attaine to be possesse: of my said estate, I give my land in case of th: Mortuallie
to my Kinsman Robt: Bourchier, and at th: command: of my robust estate, I give to be equally
dividid amongst th: grand children, of my lou: me wth Elizabeth Bourchier Dresed and her
request my leueng: friend, John Hard, & Thomas Rab: to be my executors and in th: behalfe
of my said daughter Eliz: Bourchier to be quarto: of this my last will & testam: and further I do
give my said executors, as a remembrance of my last loue, twenty shillings a y: v, nonforning
this to be my last will & testam: wth my hande & seals, the day & y: v above written /

now departed from him, & refuseth to have, any longer under his burthen, neare by
any other w^r mad^e app^r; more thn the orphant willfullnes thereto, It is ordred
that the said orphant Thomas Pinn, hys c^o abd^r: res th^t the said Cornelius Smith ha^t h^t
attain^d to the age of twenty one y^r & t^o the day whereof, if they find any iustynce
to the contrarie to remoue the said orphant /
