In body, but in perfect health and memory do here make and Ordaine this my Last Will
and Testament in manner and form following, first I recommend my Soul to Almighty
God who gave it unto me, trusting in his manifold mercies that he will wash away all my
 manifold Sins out of his Remembrance through the blood of his Son
 Jesus Christ my Saviour and Redeemer, and my body to the Earth from whence
 it was taken to be buried in Christian Buriall after the discretion of my Executors
 Abigail Walker, as for my Temporal Estate I give and bequeath in manner and form
 following, I give it is my will that after my Debts are paid that all my whole Estate
 and Land be Equally divided, between my Wife and my Abigail Walker and my
 two Children Mary and Sarah Walker, that is to say to each of them an Equal
 proportion, both of Lands Colles, Cattel, Hogs, household stuffe and every thing that
 is mine, only to remaine in the hands of my Executors till my Child be come of
 Age or be married, It is my Will that in case of Mortality of either of my for-
 named Children, that those parts shall come to the Survivor and in case of both
 their Deaths that then it shall come to Robert and Elizabeth Daughters of the
 Son and Daughter of Robert Bayne and in case my wife shall marry and not mine
 my Children, then to have it Equally divided as aforesaid to each their due share
 I hereby make and Ordaine my Dear wife Abigail my Sole Ex-^{or} and she
 to pay and Receive all or any Debts or dues of mine this being my Last Will
 Testament Revokeing all former Wills, I have here to the hand and Seal on
 this 21th Day of January 1676
