Daniell Miles aged fifty years or there about beinge sick in body but in p[er]fect memory I geve
the word I do make and ordaine this my last Will and Testament in manner and forme as followeth
I liffe to bo[ar]d[er] my soule to god wher gaude to me and right to see committ my body to the earth
from whence it came and for my worldly goods after my debts beinge truly payed and quiet as followeth
I geve my estate to my sonne John: Thilke eight hundred pounds of tobacco to be paid in such goodes as is in the
house as my wife his mother & himselfe next I geve unto son Edward my feather bed and furniture and
a feather bed and all his furniture that belongs unto it and a great brasse kitch and two painted dishes

I give and bequeath unto my younge wife Sonat Daniell two Coats and a feather bed and furniture
belonging to it, and two or peyne[?] dishes and one Brasse kitch. I give unto Elizabeth Weston one
pound or four hundred pounds of tobacco which my wife can have spent
for the use of my worldly goods both manerly and emerallie to be left with me and without doone
I give unto my wife Sonat my wife to be my true and lawfull Executrix of this my last
Will and Testament I haue here sette my hand and seal this present first day of March 1638
