In the Name of God Amen. the 13th Day of January 1675. I Francis Clark of the
Isle of Wright County, being sick & weak of Body, but of full mind & memory thanking
G. to God therefore, do make & ordain this my last will & testament. In which principally
I give my soul, unto the hands, that gave it me, and for my Body I command unto her
Earth to be buried, in Christian & decent manner, not doubtful; all the Generall or
A. sureration, so垂ue the same, by the Mighty power of God, and for my worldly
estate, I b.queath as followeth.

I give & b.queath the one halfe of my personal estate unto my w. bl. blood wife Jane Clark, and the
other halfe of my personal estate unto Humphry Clark, the sonne of John Clark, & for all my lands
the heire & hereditam to what power, that I have now in my possession or have right unto. I do give and
bequeath, unto the aforesaid, Humphry Clark, & to his heires lawfully begotten for ever, and if it shall
so happen, that the said Humphry Clark, die before he attaineth to the age of twenty one years
then my will is, that my land & personal estate shall descend & come to Robert Clark, brother to the said
Humphry Clark, and to his heires for ever, and my will is, that Jane my bl. blood wife, shall have the
possession & use of this plantation, during the termes of her naturall life, & my will is, that the said
Humphry Clark, leave up his Grand Mother, my bl. blood wife Jane, on the plantation before mentioned
and to have his maner, tenement, & duration in learning, out of the labour of serdants, & serdant
of the said plantation. And as for my two Negros, I do give on: Negro named Francis, to the aforesaid
Humphry Clark, and the other Negro, called Doby, to my w. bl. blood wife, Jane, & the use of my
servants, And if it shall so fall out, that the aforesaid Negroes, do refuse, or are not willing, to be serdants
my aforesaid wife, then my said wife make free of the said Negroes, & with the produce
of the said plantation, for the use of my said wife, & Humphry Clark as aforesaid, And my will
is, that Jane, my wife, be rebled & sold, by the aforesaid, of this my last will & testament, to pay my debts
that my w. bl. blood friend m^r: Robert Clark, & m^r: John Clark, & my Clerke, to p^t this my
last will & testament performed, written my hand & seal, the day & year above written;
