The last Will and Testament of Francis Nes of the lower parish of the Isle of Wight  
County being, vivante in body but in perfect senex and memory

I give my soule to god who gave it me and my body to the earth to be decently buried  
 in hopes of a joyfull resurrection and as for my worldly goods I dispose of as followeth

To my daughter Judith Norcross by one gracie Bristle little that may hold sweetened or light  
kind gallons and one new dressing jar one flosson tin Larky feather shaver, tin Larky and  
other things and one white one yard of oxen to be delivered to her next October Come twelve  
months which past time of is due to her out of her late fathers estate and the rest given and bought  
attends her

all into his  
I quit my some John Jles one young hooff which his grand father left him four cows with calf  
or calves by them added, and two skin with a yoke and good plough thame one father bid with  
boulders three a pair of blankets and pair of socks with a little of my Indian curios and ballons  
one chest one gun four Eurs and a ham and two bowls of two years old apoc and four  
bowls of two years old apoc with a pipe up water with and two basons of one sort and one ear  
-lard and drinking cup two brass candle sticks one brass kettle and more as two brass pans  
and a pipe up water plates all the rest I quit onto my some John Jles my Indian boy Dick to be a slave  
-ent to my some when he is at age of living; and in the mean time to remain in my some  
Tristram has worthily possession and four hundred and fifty pounds of tobacco yearly till he be

For giving my daughter Francis Rodger ten shillings in money and to her eldest daughter Francis House  
Ten out young man to be delivered to her as soon as the said Mary hath brought by her 6th  
For giving to my daughter Elizabeth Rodger to the value of five thousand pounds of tobacco out  
at 11 lb. per cwt. at two payments in two years

and for shortly to be paid all two payments in two years  
and for shortly to be appointed my bonny Trustam Kersworthy my sole Executor and  
to be his my Will performed and for any part of my Estate which is and is to be of after my death  
paid I give unto my bonny Trustam Kersworthy my Executor as written for my hand and seal  
this fifteenth day of May 1631
