 of March in 1687
 I give my soul to my maker and redeemer my Body to the earth to be buried in
 Christian maner and as for my worldly goods I give and bequeath as followeth
 I give unto alive Davis one Cow Calfe year & out
 I give unto Jⁿ. Davis my Coffin, one bedding: slow and after all my debts paid and discharged
 I give and bequeath all the rest of my worldly goods to my will & loathd Luffen Haggard the Heirs
 daughter to John Harris: and in case of mortality then to my Executor and I do make my will
 & loathd Brother John Harris my whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament
 in Witness whereunto I have set my hand and seal this day and year above written
 Francis Hobbs. Seal
 Test Jⁿ. Davis George Bill Jun^r Thomas Harris
 Proved by John Davis and George Bill
 to be the last Will and Testament of Francis
 Hobbs died in Court held for the shire of Wright
 County June 4th 1688 Test John Pitt & Co

The nuncupative Will of William Watson being proved by the oaths of Jⁿ primm and John
 portis: is that William Watson congue all the estate that he had to his brother John Watson
 saying that his sister should have none of it for she was unnatural to him being a natural tynd
 by him and would not come to see him
 This Will was proved in the shire of Wright County Court June the 4th 1688 to be the
 Will and Testament of William Watson died by the oaths of John primm and John portis
 as is evidenced hereunto

The deposition of John primm aged 22 years or thereabouts sayeth that William Watson
 did with yo^r deponent to take notice that I give all to my brother John Watson likewise sayeth that
 if I have a sister she might have come and seen me but is a natural one for she has been found
 tynd at the Court house and never came to see me. So I do with that she might have nothing of
 it had further yo^r deponent sayeth neth
 sworn to in open Court June 4th 1688 Test

The deposition of John portis aged 29 years sayeth that when William Watson was upon
 his death bed yo^r deponent to take notice that if he had an estate that his brother John
 Watson should have it all, and that his sister should have none; they say that I have a sister
 but if she is a natural one for she has been at the Court house: a natural tynd and
 never came to see me further yo^r deponent sayeth neth
 sworn to in open Court June the 4th 1688 Test
