

In the Name of God Amen, I Henry King of the Iles of right Comy being
weak in Body, but in perfect Memory do make & ordaine this my last will and
testament in manner & forms followinge, first I bequeath my soules into the hands
of Iesus Christ, hopinge through his merits & merites, to obtaine everlasting
life, And for my worldly goods, I dispose of as followeth, first

I give & bequeath to my daughters Susanna and Elizabeth my whole dividend of
land, beinge nine hundred acres according to patent, and former gift given to me
by my decessed father, and confirmed by my Mother, Elizabeth Kinge since decessed,
And my will is, that my youngest daughter, Elizabeth have the lower part of the
land, next Edward Joynters, for her part of it, And my eldest daughter, the upper
part of it, where I now live, And that my lovinge wife, Ruth Kinge enjoy my
plantation, wchall grunelodges, of horseferry, and what so ever else, belongeth to it, my
contemurys, duringe her naturall life, And after her decess to my children above
expressed & their heirs, or the survivors of them & their heirs for ever

I give one hundred acres of land, lyinge & beinge next adjacent to M^r England, and
beinge reserved for land of myns, now in the possession of M^r England to this parrish
where I now live towards the maintenance of a free school, And I give to John
Russell now my servant, a cow & a cowe calf, to be delivered in April next, And in case
the said Russell dye, before he come of age, or have issue, then the Cattel to returne to
my children againe, And the remainder, of my Cattel, I give one halfe to my lovinge wife
and the other halfe to my children both male & female, And my household goods & hoggs
I freely give to my lovinge wife, And for my horse & Mares, I give to my two daughters
Susanna & Elizabeth Kinge, my younge bay Whilke & my last yeres Mars, & Coult of the
gray mare, to be equally divided betwixt them, when they are married, or the survivors of
them & their heirs fully & to all intents & purposes for ever, And my will is, that my wife
have the remainder of them, at her disposal, And that no waife be made of timber upon
the land, And that my two daughters, above said be brought up to learninge, and maintained
out of my estate, And for my other part, And all the remainder, of my estate, I give to my
lovinge wife, makinge her my whole & sole executrix, & confirminge this to be my last will
& testament, wch my hand & seal, this second day of March 1668
