me out of this mortall life, to dearely bounde at his discretion of myt Reynoldis my  
lovinge wife, where god hev by his perteine commandement appointe my only and sole heire and  
of this my last will and Testament: And thid ic is my will that my said heire shal haue  
my just debts the greatest part beinge due to Robt. Rat wherof god be his judge, after  
the remainder part of my estate it shall plese god to leave to him as well as to his  
gives it equally betwix my sayd wife and Henry Reynolds and Edward Reynolds my two children  
and to the longest livers of them two: and in case of his death before they shall come to  
the yeares of discretion or to marriad: that then what is left shal come to them to attaine  
to them another: and at his dispositiōn provided that my said children may attaine and add  
with them sayd mother: untill they shall come to yeaers of discretion: this ringe my last will  
and Testament remouinge and remouinge all former wills I haue written to sett my hand  
to it.
