last will and Testament in maner and forme following: viz: In prime foreknowledge my soul
to the Everliving God, who gave it me hoping for pardon & remission of my sins in the
Blood of my Saviour & Redeemer Jesus Christ: and my body when it shall please God to call for
me out of this mortal life, to be discreetly buried at the discretion of my son Henry Reynolds my
last and wife: who I do hereby by these present nominall bequeath my only and sole Exors and
of this my last will and Testament: Revolving it is my will that my said Exors pay all
my Just debts the greatest part being due to the late whereunto I have paid, as for
the remainder part of my estate it shall please the Lord to divide it with my said Exors
give it equally betwixt my said wife: and Henry Reynolds and Sarah Reynolds my two children
and be the longest lived of the three: and in case of the said death before they shall come to
the years of discretion or be married: that then what is bequeathed unto them: be returned
to their mother: and at her disposal: provided that my said children stay unmarried and old
with their said mother: until they shall come to years or be married: this being my last will
and Testament Revolving and remembrance all former Wills I have heretofore by my hand &
